ELECTION COMMISSION

Absentee Voting

The Election Commission (EC) has worked diligently in the past year to develop methods for offering Absentee Voting (AV) to Tribal members as well as working to amend the Pueblo's Election Law. This is a very tedious process with many details involved and there is still much work to be done.

The EC is very devoted to encouraging tribal members to vote in Pueblo Elections and we feel that creating an opportunity for members (who meet certain criteria) to vote via Absentee is important!

The EC is proposing the following AV eligibility for **Enrolled Tribal Members**:

- Age 65 or older
- Homebound Seniors
- Residing Out-of-State
- Out-of-State College Students
- Enrolled in the U.S. Military

In an effort to gain information and feedback from the community regarding the possibility of offering Absentee Voting for Tribal Elections, the Election Commission has developed a survey for participation by Tribal Members who meet certain criteria at this time. A reminder of what's Recyclable

- ⇒ Newspaper
- ⇒ Cardboard (corrugated boxes, cereal & cracker boxes, etc.)
- ⇒ Paper grocery bags

- ⇒ Magazines, junk mail, stationary and envelopes (even window envelopes)
- ⇒ Aluminum/tin cans, foil trays (again, rinse them out first)
- ⇒ All plastic food containers #1 & #2
- **⇒ Microwave food TRAYS**

Remember, if items are covered in food, its not recyclable. Food is one of the most contaminates in the recycling process and some estimates put the cost of irresponsible contaminates in the neighborhood of \$700 million per year industry-wide. So please be sure to rinse out cups, cans, jars, etc. before throwing in the bin. Thank you!

Any person(s) who shall dispose of any garbage or other forms of litter or waste anywhere within the exterior boundaries of the Pueblo of San Ildefonso. including waterways, roadpublic ways, roads. campgrounds or other public places, except in public waste disposal grounds designated by the San Ildefonso Tribal Council shall be guilty of a violation and, upon conviction thereof, may by subject to pay penalty assessment of a minimum of \$500.00 and a maximum of \$1,000.00, with costs, or to such other orders of the Court, and may be required to clean

Returning Students: A student who is currently attending any LAPS school will be a returning student for the 2022-2023 school year. elementary school to the middle school, or 8th grade students at the middle school moving to Topper Freshman Academy for the 2022-2023 school year are considered returning students.

New Students: Out-of-district students who wish to attend LAPS and did not attend a LAPS school during the 2021-2022 school should apply using the Open Registration Form. New students residing in Los Alamos County should also use the New Student Registration Form.

Kindergarten: Admission to kindergarten as required by New Mexico State Statute (N.M. Stat. Ann. § 22-13-3), shall be made solely on the basis of chronological age. A child who is 5 years of age prior to 12:01 am MDT on September 1 of the school year can enter kindergarten at the beginning of that school year. Students who were part of the NM PreK program or PK4 who are enrolling in kindergarten for the 2021-2022 school year may enroll as returning students for the kindergarten enrollment. The Kindergarten Requirements Letter may be found here. Kindergarten Roundup will be held on Wednesday, April 13 at each elementary site.

Preschool: Preschool programs are available at all five elementary schools. However, this program is not open to out-of-district students. A child who is 4 years of age prior to 12:01 am MDT on September 1, 2022 may enroll for preschool for the 2022-2023 school year.

Online Learning Options: The Los Alamos Online Learning Academy is also an option for students in kindergarten through 8th grade who wish to learn in an online setting rather than in person.




