Our next Senior Meeting will be on Wednesday May 18, 2022, at the Senior Center (we hope). Agenda is below.

#### Mother's Day

There has been much discussion about a Mother's Day Treat during our senior meetings. Suggestions included a basket perhaps full of chocolate, crossword puzzles and other items., Going to Gabriel's, Rancho Chimayo or other eateries. There was also a discussion about getting gift certificates for Smith's or Walmart or Albertson's so that senior mothers could get whatever they wanted like such as steak, flowers, candy or other items.

There are approximately 64 senior mothers who are age 60 and above who live here. The cost of getting a restaurant willing to accept 64 mothers is beyond our ability. And it would hurt our budget a lot. Therefore, the best decision is to get those mothers who live here at San I a Gift Card with \$20 on the card so that each mother can decide where they want to go and what they want to do with those funds.

We wish all the mothers who live here at San I a Happy Mother's Day. For you are all wonderful, beautiful, smart, charitable and so kind.

You will need to request the credit card. You can do this by calling 505-455-4105 and put your name, age (must be 60+) and address (must have zip of 87506) on the list. You need to do this no later than May 3, 2022. You can also email: tsd@sanipueblo.org. Once we have a list of those who requested these cards and mail them out to you. If you so wish, you can indicate when you call or email that you will pick up the card. We hope to get these cards into your hands no later than May 7, one day before Mother's Day. We are limiting the cards to those who are 60+ and who have an address with an 87506 zip due to budget constraints.

All the planters for this year have been taken.

Those of you who have planters from last year, note that we have ordered fertilizer packets for your planters. They include fertilizer and the cover sheet to protect from weeds and the cover serves as a planting guide. They have arrived and you can pick them up at the tribal services office (next to the receptionist). These normally cost about \$9, but we don't charge for them. These are specific to the grow box planters.

# TEWA OUTREACH SELF PROFICIENCY SURVEY





The Pueblo de San Ildefonso has brought on Mrs. Nichole Summer Martinez, as the new part-time Tewa Outreach Coordinator to implement the Pueblo's Federal Administration of Native Americans Grant to preserve the Tewa language.

The *Powhogeh Owingeh* Tewa Speaks project will video document word pronunciations and syntax of the Tewa language spoken in the Pueblo de San Ildefonso. This project will have the community members self-identify Tewa language fluency among members in the 194 households in the Pueblo.

Fluent tribal member speakers will be referred to participate in the filming process under the direction of videographer Ms. Charine Gonzales and associated grant staff.

The result of this project will establish an archive of videos documenting the spoken Tewa language and oral language traditions of the Pueblo de San Ildefonso. This will then serve as a substantial resource for forming future language program development and Tewa education in the Pueblo.

After initial door to door contact the Coordinator will set up a meeting with each household that can take place in person or on Zoom. If you would like to text, email or call Summer to receive the survey through email to reduce contact please do so at the information below.

EARTH DAY WHY EVERYDAY RECYCLE?

Recycling is a great way to protect our environment and stimulate our economy. Recycling **saves resources, prevents pollution, supports public health, and creates jobs**. It saves money, avoids landfills, and best of all, it's easy.

Please remember this contest is to help encourage you to recycle and <u>KEEP</u> recycling.

By recycling, you are reducing the amount of waste that goes in your trash bins, in our bins and in landfills.

Remember, if items are covered in food, its not recyclable. Please be sure to rinse out cups, cans, jars, etc. before throwing in the bin.

Food is one of the most contaminates in the recycling process and some estimates put the cost of irresponsible contaminates in the neighborhood of \$700 million per year industry-wide. Thank you.





#### Please Dispose Trash Properly in appropriate bins



- Bagged Household Waste = GREEN Compactor Bin
- Recyclables = WHITE Recycle Bin
  - <u>No glass items, No trash, No food !!</u>
  - If you have your recyclables a plastic bag please dump items out in bin. If you need a list of what is recyclable and what is not accepted, please stop by for one.
- Metals = GREY Metal Bin
- Weeds and branches = Please dispose below the bins at the bottom of the hill. <u>Please DO NOT mix trash with</u> weeds or branches.
- We DO NOT accept OIL or TIRES

RECYCLING BAGS ARE AVAILABLE

Recycling bags are now available and can be picked up at the Transfer Station.

<u>REMINDER</u>

Please <u>EMPTY</u> bag(s) into Recycling bin. DO NOT THROW BAG IN BIN



#### DOES THE CITY RECYCLE GLASS?

Yes, the City recycles glass! Glass is accepted at all City drop-off locations, and at the Buckman Road Recycling and Transfer Station.

#### WHY CAN'T I PUT GLASS INTO MY RECYCLING CART?

Single-stream recycling – where all the items are mixed together in one cart and collected by an automated truck – increases recycling rates and is much safer than the old hand-collection system. When the City made this switch in 2017, curbside glass collection was no longer physically possible or economically viable because the City's MRF does not have the equipment to sort glass from the other materials in the carts.

#### WHAT IF I CAN'T TRANSPORT MY GLASS TO A DROP-OFF LOCATION?

If you can't make it to a drop-off site to recycle your glass, it's okay to place it in your green trash cart.

# **Close Up: All About Glass**

#### WHERE DOES THE GLASS GO FOR RECYCLING?

The glass collected at the drop-offs in Santa Fe is shipped to Momentum Recycling, a glass recycling plant in Colorado. Visit their website (colorado.momentumrecycling.com) to learn more.

#### How do I prepare glass for recycling?

Glass taken to a drop-off location should be emptied of any food/liquid. Remove plastic and metal caps; wrappers and labels can be left on.

Glass and metal can be recycled infinitely – the material doesn't degrade during the recycling process!

# You are eligible to receive an incentive if you:

- Have received your COVID-19 vaccine 1st, 2nd, <u>AND</u> 3rd dose (booster) before the deadline.
- Are an enrolled member of the Pueblo de San Ildefonso Tribe?
- Have a record of your vaccinations.
- <u>HAVE NOT</u> yet received your \$60 Gift Card Incentive?

ALL you have to do to receive your <u>\$60 incentive</u>:

Provide your COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card with all required doses to the COVID Response Team.

Bring card to the HHS Office, email it to covid@sanipueblo.org or text it to (505) 252-5986. Gift cards can be picked up in-person or mailed.
