EXECUTIVE ORDER 2022-03 AMENDED ORDER REGARDING COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

This AMENDED ORDER REGARDING COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS is issued pursuant to Section 2.2.1 AUTHORIZING EMERGENCY POWERS TO GOVERNOR and Executive Order 2021-01. This Amended Order will be effective immediately and will remain in effect until further notice. This Amended Order may be adjusted as needed to meet the Pueblo's public health and safety needs and changing COVID-19 conditions.

SECTION 1. ACCESS TO THE PUEBLO

- 1. The Pueblo is currently in *Phase 3* of its Reopening.
 - a. The Reopening phase of the Pueblo is subject to change based on COVID-19 conditions in the community.
- 2. The Pueblo is currently open to the general public.
- 3. There is currently no daily curfew or lockdown requirement in the Pueblo
- 4. Tribal offices and buildings, including the El Rancho Property, are available for community use at this time. Such gatherings are subject to the COVID-19 requirements established for that facility. Contact Governor's Office for the COVID-19 requirements for the El Rancho facility.

SECTION 2. COVID-19 GUIDANCE FOR RESIDENTS

1. THE EXECUTIVE ORDER IS STILL ACTIVE AND HAS NOT BEEN RESCINDED

- a. Individuals should continue to exercise caution when engaging in public activities and practice everyday preventive actions, which include: wearing a mask in public, practicing social (physical) distancing, disinfecting high-touch surfaces, avoiding unnecessary travel, avoiding unnecessary public gatherings, and washing hands for 20 seconds.
- **b.** Wearing a mask in public is not mandatory, but is recommended for those at high-risk and in large crowds.

2. IF YOU HAVE BEEN CONFIRMED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

a. If you have tested positive for COVID-19, you must report this information as soon as the test results are confirmed to any member of the COVID-19 Response & Recovery Team at (505) 252-5986 for guidance. Reporting information will be kept confidential to the extent allowable, consistent with HIPAA privacy standards and disease-reporting requirements.

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- b. You must immediately stay at home, isolate yourself from other members in your household as much as possible and follow the directives from your doctor, the COVID-19 Response & Recovery Team, and the public health guidance provided.
- **c.** Regardless of vaccination status, stay home and stay away from others for 12 days from the day your symptoms appeared, and you haven't had a fever for at least 24 hours without medication, and symptoms have improved.
- **d.** If you tested positive for COVID-19 but don't have symptoms, stay home until after 12 days have passed since your positive test.
- e. Regardless of vaccination status, isolation can be shortened to 7 days *ONLY* if a test on day 7 is negative *AND* no symptoms or resolving symptoms. All positive cases should mask for the full 12 days, both in and outside of the home.
- f. You will be contacted by the Pueblo or its designee, to follow up on the status of your condition and to obtain background information. This may be by telephone.

3. IF YOU HAVE BEEN IN CLOSE CONTACT WITH ANYONE WHO HAS SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 OR HAS TESTED POSITIVE

a. Individuals who have symptoms consistent with COVID-19, or who have been in close contact with someone who has COVID-19, should call the COVID-19 Response & Recovery Team for guidance and their doctor or healthcare provider.

4. GATHERINGS

- a. There are currently no gathering restrictions.
- **b.** All gathering limits are subject to change based on COVID-19 conditions in the community.

5. TRAVEL RECOMMENDATIONS

- a. Due to the current Omicron variant surge, travel recommendations are as follows:
 - i. You should delay travel until you are fully vaccinated or received the booster vaccine dose(s) that you are eligible to receive.
 - ii. Avoid all unnecessary travel.
 - iii. If you are sick or in quarantine, stay home unless you are seeking medical attention.
 - iv. If possible, you should use alternative methods, such as virtual or telephonic methods, for meetings and appointments.
 - v. You should consider testing for COVID-19 two to three days before and five days after traveling, as a precaution.

6. **DEFINITIONS**

- **a.** Fully Vaccinated: You have completed the primary series of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine within the last 5 months; *OR* You have completed the primary series of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine within the last 2 months
- b. Vaccinated Up to Date: You're considered "up to date" if you have received the booster vaccine dose(s) that you are eligible to receive.

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SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH TRIBAL ORDERS AND ENFORCEMENT

- 1. **COMPLIANCE.** All individuals are expected to support and comply with the Pueblo's Orders, directives and protocols, including the requirements regarding isolation and self-quarantine, for everyone's safety and well-being. If you fail to comply with any Executive Order, public health order or directive related to COVID-19 Recovery, you will be cited and subject to a fine or penalty.
- 2. FINES AND PENALTIES. Pursuant to the authority delegated under Section 2.2.1 of the Pueblo's laws, the following fines and penalties are established for failure to comply with the Pueblo's Public Health Orders or other Pueblo directives related to the COVID-19 public health emergency:
 - a. First Offense: Written warning.
 - b. Second Offense: \$100 Fine
 - c. Third Offense: \$200 Fine
 - d. Fourth Offense: Temporary Exclusion from the Pueblo for a period to be determined by the Governor, not to exceed 90 days.
 - e. Flagrant Violation or Aggravating Circumstances: In event of a flagrant violation or if there are aggravating circumstances, fines do not need to be issued in sequential order and can include temporary exclusion from the Pueblo for a period to be determined by Governor, not to exceed 90 days.
- 3. AUTHORITY TO ENFORCE. The Pueblo has adopted a "zero tolerance" for violations of this Executive Order, with violations to be enforced by law enforcement. The Governor authorizes BIA Law Enforcement and the Pojoaque Police Department to assist as necessary to enforce the Pueblo's COVID-19 Public Health Orders, including the issuance of citations or transportation of noncompliant individuals.
- 4. PAYMENT OF FINES. Payment of fines shall be made to the Pueblo Finance Department within thirty (30) days of issuance of a citation.
- 5. NOTICE AND EFFECTIVE DATE. This Executive Order serves as Public Notice of the Fines and Penalties which will become effective immediately.

The Pueblo leadership understands that the community is suffering from COVID-19 fatigue and that this has been hard on everyone. We appreciate everyone who has gotten vaccinated as part of the community-wide effort to keep our community and people safe and healthy. But we cannot let our guard down and become lax in our efforts to combat the COVID-19 virus and the even more contagious variants. That is why we continue to take small steps toward recovery from the pandemic. We ask for your continued support, patience, and understanding to do your part to help the Pueblo de San Ildefonso community remain strong and healthy.
