Dear Community Members:

You may have read an article about the chromium plume on DOE/LANL lands and that contaminants are moving toward the Pueblo. We would like to reaffirm that this issue is of the highest priority for the Governor and Tribal Council. We would also like to give you some background on this as articles and statements do not always give the full picture. Please be assured that the Pueblo has and is taking actions to monitor the situation and work with DOE and the New Mexico Environmental Department (NMED) on the chromium plume.

This plume is a result of many years dating back from 1956 to 1972, of improper dumping of contaminated wastewater into canyon systems on LANL property. The chromium waste migrated down through the ground levels and the underground plume was discovered in 2003. The Pueblo was notified of this plume by DOE and has been communicating with DOE about potential methods to stop the plume from moving toward the Pueblo and ways to clean up the plume. DOE has worked with the Pueblo to set up a monitoring wells on and off of Pueblo lands to track the water quality along the Pueblo's boundary on the southside of the Pueblo's Sacred Area. DOE has made presentations to the Council and Pueblo community over the years on the efforts to contain and clean up the plume. This will continue moving forward.

The Pueblo was surprised by the notice from the NMED that it ordered DOE to halt its interim measures on the plume cleanup. NMED had not informed the Pueblo prior to issuing the notice to DOE, nor had DOE been informed of this as I had just had my monthly meeting with DOE officials and this was not raised. The Pueblo has met with NMED to express concern about how this matter was handled and that the Pueblo needed to be informed about these types of decisions and the basis for them.

In response to the NMED Order, the Pueblo's Environmental Department (DECP) has determined that based on the available information and data reviewed by DECP, there is no indication that chromium is present above background levels on Pueblo land. The information and data shared by DOE about the interim measures in place show the measures are working in drawing the plume away from the Pueblo. The Pueblo understands there are data gaps in the characterization of the plume and DOE is working on addressing the gaps in order to get a more complete picture of the plume and how it is reacting to the injection wells that are returning treated water into the ground. The NMED has not shared with the Pueblo any information, data, or modeling that shows otherwise.

The Pueblo will continue to work closely with DOE to monitor and assess the chromium plume situation. The Pueblo will also work with NMED to assure better communication and understanding of the NMED's concerns and approaches for the chromium plume. Most importantly, the Pueblo's Environmental Department will monitor all available data and provide updates and advice to the Pueblo's leadership on this situation.

I encourage you to reach out to my office or DECP Director, Raymond Martinez, if you have any questions about the chromium plume matter. We are here to provide you with any information that we may have about the plume and the cleanup and containment measures.

Tax Filing

One option for free federal and state filing: <https://www.olt.com/main/oltfree/default.asp>

Your adjusted gross income must be less than \$41,000 to get free filing, or be in the military, or be over age 67 with income between 41K and 71K. If you are a Senior (age 55+) and are unable to get on the internet or just need assistance, please make an appointment with the Tribal Services Director at 505-455-4105 or tsd@sanipueblo.org and Stuart can assist you to file your returns.

Internet Payments

A reminder that there is a federal program that can assist with paying internet service bills. It's from the Federal Communication Commission (FCC) and it's call the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). You can go to this website to see if you are eligible for the program:

Enrollment Office

We remind everyone that any tribal member can review their own tribal membership file and insert information in it such as copies of your birth certificate, marriage certificate and other documents or photo. Our files are enclosed in a fire-resistant file cabinet, so they should be safe for future generations.

Tribal IDs

A reminder that our Tribal IDs expire after 2 years. Please check your expiration date and if expired, please come to the Tribal Services Office at the Admin Building and get it renewed. If living out of state, you can send a headshot to tsd@sanipueblo.org. Renewal cost is \$10. Under age 19, it's free.

Animal Reminder

Our current animal control law does not allow the free roaming of animals. They are to be supervised or controlled at all times. This normally means kennels, enclosed areas or leashes. Dogs or cats not being supervised or leashed will be picked up and turned over to the local animal shelter. Traps will be placed around the Pueblo to catch strays. These will also be turned over to the local animal shelter.

FROM THE OFFICE OF THE PROJECT MANAGER

Project Updates

March 2023

- **Administrative Office – Portal Improvements**

The concrete work and cement installation is complete at the Tribal Administration Building. We are anticipating delivery and installation of the shade structure and picnic benches before mid-March. Thank you for your patience during the entry closures.

- **Pueblo-Wide Roofing Projects**

The Senior Center, Realty Bay, Maintenance Building, Learning Center, and Tewa Center have now all been completed. Roofing at the Tribal Administration building has started, and the roof is now being prepped. The Administration building will not be completed until this spring when the weather warms up and the HVAC units can be removed.

- **Gymnasium Renovation Project**

Demolition work to the restrooms and locker rooms has been completed. TJC construction is now working on texture application and painting the new restrooms and storage area; and preparing for the plumbers. Painting of the exterior of the building should take place in April when the weather warms up. Cement will be poured along the Southside of the building, and the installation of a shade structure will be completed in May 2023. Full project completion is still scheduled for June 15, 2023.

- **Tewa Center Renovations**

The new HVAC duct work and new HVAC units have been installed. The restrooms have been demoed, and plumbing in the kitchen area has started.

- **Tewa Tank Rehabilitation Project**

The Tewa Tank Renovation project started on February 23, 2023 and includes: installation of new vent hatches, new handrails, remove and install new shell manways, modify and repair the Liquid Level Gauge, remove existing antenna supports, and interior and exterior coating systems. The project will begin with improvements to the access road up to the tank so that heavy equipment can be mobilized at the tank site. The Pueblo is now utilizing the Black Mesa water tank for domestic water source, there seems to not be any problems with water pressure in the Pueblo. (if you experience any problems with your water pressure, please contact the Project Manager's Office or Rayven Begaye at 505-670-0984)



- **Community Wellness Center**

In Coordination with the San Ildefonso Health and Human Services Department, a Request for Proposals for Design/Engineering Services was published in February 2023. The Pueblo has secured \$700,000 to date to plan and design the new facility, which will be a build-out/addition to the Gymnasium. - **Wastewater – Lagoon Monitoring Project**

Vigil Enterprises (VEI) has been awarded a project to install monitoring wells at the existing Wastewater Lagoon sites. The monitoring wells will provide information on current nitrates in the soil and will provide data on underground flows from compromised lagoons.

- **Povi Ka and Shumaa Po Projects**

Striping on Povi Ka will be completed in March 2023. Please use caution while using the roadway and adhere to all speed limit signs. The repaving of Shumaa Po will take place in March and April 2023 and will be completed by April 30th – we will inform the Community of the road closure and detours/alternate routes prior to the project start date.

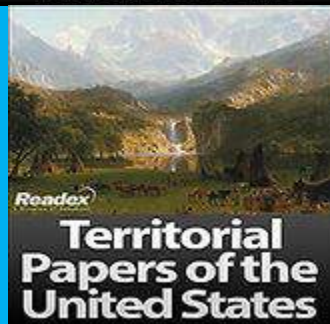
