GREETINGS,

May is Mental Health Month and we want to take this opportunity to let you know that through the efforts of the Tribal Council, Governor Moquino and the Health and Human Services Department there is a behavioral health program here to serve you! As we begin to offer our services we wanted to share some thoughts with you about the importance of getting help when you need it, whenever you need it. Don't wait for a crisis, or to get into trouble in some way, just come on by and get support. Unfortunately we do know that some people can feel uncomfortable with the thought of getting help for mental health, substance use and addictions due to stigma.

It's no secret that addiction and mental health issues continue to be stigmatized in our society. Unfortunately, this stigma often causes people to suffer in silence and avoid seeking the help they need. Here at San Ildefonso Pueblo's Behavioral Health program, we believe that reducing stigma is one of the most crucial steps towards helping people achieve recovery.

It's also important to remember that addiction and mental health issues can affect anyone. These issues are incredibly common, and should never be a source of shame or judgment. In fact, there are more people in recovery from addiction than there are actively struggling with addiction.

Recovery can be a difficult journey, but it's one that can and does happen every single day. That's why our behavioral health program is here to support those who may be struggling. We offer unique services that help not only individuals but their families as well. Families can learn valuable skills and techniques on how to support their loved ones in our Family Empowerment Project.

Overall, it's essential to remember that there is hope for recovery. San Ildefonso Pueblo's behavioral health program is excited to be a part of this journey and looks forward to serving our community. If you or someone you know could benefit from our program, please reach out. Remember, recovery is possible for everyone!

Acoma Pueblo and San Carlos Apache. She has been in the substance abuse field for over 20 years, primarily working in Pueblo communities across New Mexico. She has lived and experienced addiction's negative impact personally, with family, friends and community. That journey caused her to seek help, resources, personal skills and in the process she has found life fulfilling work. Santana has helped people with virtually every type of addiction and their co-occurring challenges.



NADIA HAROON, MPS, LMHC has a Bachelor's in Communications from Ohio University and a Master of Professional Studies in Art Therapy & Creativity Development from Pratt Institute in New York. Nadia completed additional training in Clinical Counseling during her graduate studies and has trained in Integrative Humanistic Counseling. UPDATED INFORMATION FOR COVID VACCINES

- If you are 6 years of age or older and <u>HAVE</u> received the COVID BIVALENT BOOSTER (Pfizer or Moderna) you are <u>UP TO DATE</u> and do not need to take any action
- Those <u>65</u> years and older <u>OR</u> are immunocompromised you ARE ELIGIBLE FOR A 2ND BIVALENT BOOSTER

Per recommendations, everyone ages 6 years and older should get a BIVALENT MRNA COVID-19 vaccine dose, regardless of whether they previously completed their primary (monovalent) series.

- Elders remain the most at risk for hospitalization and death, yet less than half of all elders have received a BIVALENT dose. The initial BIVALENT dose offers additional protection that is critical to prevent waning immunity.
- Fewer than a quarter of younger individuals have received a BIVALENT dose.

For individuals who have NEVER been vaccinated, now a single BIVALENT dose of a mRNA vaccine will get them up to date.

COVID Vaccines for children ages 6 months – 5 years

 \blacktriangleright PFIZER (6 months – 4 years) **<u>OR</u>** \triangleright MODERNA (6 months – 5 years)

Depending on vaccines received for this age group, recommendation is to receive 1 or 2 BIVALENT doses. You may call the Santa Clara Health Center if you have questions.

Did you know that June is National Great Outdoors Month? This month recognizes and highlights the natural beauty we live in and among. Whether you decide to take time to enjoy a walk, bike a trail, camp out, or enjoy a day fishing, nature is calling!

There are mental health benefits of outdoor adventures. One study found outdoor and adventure education programs increased mindfulness in young individuals. In addition, it was determined outdoor activities can improve beliefs that individuals they can complete a task or goal (selfefficacy), and it also opened up opportunities where people evaluated different aspects of their lives (subjective well-being). The key finding suggests that outdoor education and wilderness programs can foster mental health in youth and young individuals. So when you get a few minutes, plan some time in your day to explore the great outdoors.

Other activities could include taking a photography class, camping in your backyard, or exploring and identifying the wildlife within your surroundings.

We do not take oil and tires. The cost to dispose of these items is VERY costly and can take years to get rid of. Due to community members leaving these items when an attendant is not present, we have taken the measures to close during the lunch hour. We are very sorry for the inconvenience.

We encourage you to take advantage of the Buckman free tire event posted in calendar or dispose of them right away when tires get changed. Most Auto repair shops will take successfully collected oil such as AutoZone or Jiffy Lube

Improvement Projects at the Transfer Station

The Transfer Station will be under improvement and construction. The porject will be taking place the beginning of <u>June and go through August.</u>

We are hoping this will not affect the daily operations, however, we are asking the community for your patience and cooperation with the following:

- Speed Limit extra works maybe on site during this time. Please slow down when entering and leaving premises.

Senior Trash Pick Up



Please remember to follow all guidelines for Trash Pick up services. If you are in violation of any guideline(s), your trash will <u>NOT</u> be picked up for the day.

- Services are provided for Tribal community member of the age of 65 and older, homebound or no transportation available.
- Pick Up Services are EVERY Thursday *
- Bags MUST be ready for pick by 8:30 am*
- (3) Bag limit for each Senior household listed
- Dogs must be in house or on leash. If dogs are present, bags will NOT be picked up.
- Bags MUST be tied. UNTIED and TORN bags will NOT be picked up.
- Bags must be visible and easy accessible*
- NO WEEDS will be picked up, only household waste.

*Exceptions are made for disabled community members. Must confirm with Transfer Station Attendant of needs.

* Routes, times and dates can change for many reasons at any time.

If your trash was not picked up, a NO PICK-UP NOTICE will be left and reasons why. If you have any questions, please contact Transfer Station Staff.

SIGN UP! Any Seniors that meets the requirements for the service are encouraged to fill out a form and submit to the Transfer Station to be added to the list.

BINS IN THE FUTRE!

The Transfer Station staff are working in providing Seniors Garbage bins for better services and access during pick up routes. These bin will only be for the Senior that participate in the services and will be property of the Transfer Station.





The Transfer station has specific bins and areas to dispose of your waste. Here are the following areas to place your waste.

BINS:

- **GREEN** Compactor Bin = Bagged Household Waste
- WHITE Recycle Bin = Recyclables
 - <u>No glass items, No trash, No</u> <u>food !!</u>
 - If you have your recyclables in plastic bags, please dump items out in bin. If you need a list of what is recyclable and what is not accepted, please stop by for one.
- GREY Metal Bin = scrap metal items. Dryers & Washers are accepted in the metal bin.

DESIGNATED AREAS:

- Green Waste = Bin located below drop off area. Trees branches, weeds, yard waste ONLY-NO TRASH!
- Refrigerator & Freezers
- E-Waste Electronic waste

If your not sure where to dispose an item(s), please ask an attendant.

We are **Keres Community Health (KCH)**. KCH is an initiative of **Keres Consulting**, **Inc**, a Native American Small Disadvantaged Business with expertise in supporting health initiatives in Native American communities. We strive to ensure health equity in Tribal Communities through best practices, outreach and engagement, self-determined education, partnerships, and sustainability.

KCH is currently working with the New Mexico Indian Affairs Department for its Tobacco Cessation and Prevention Program. This project will provide a fresh approach to youth education in relation to abstaining from nicotine products and connection to cultural values as a protective factor from risk behavior. According to the most recent available data, 11.2% of American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/AN) middle school students use e-cigarettes, and 6.7% use cigarettes (New Mexico Risk and Resiliency Survey, 2017). Among AI/AN high school youth, 11.5% use e-cigarettes and 11.5% use cigarettes (NM-IBIS, 2019).

KCH will lead creation of a comic strip series with New Mexico Indigenous youth as protagonists. In these comics, the target audience will see themselves portrayed in the comic books as the stories' heroes while learning important healthy lifestyles. KCH will interview and collaborate with youth statewide to create a comic strip for each of the 22 tribes in the state. The one-hour interview will include a discussion about the impact of commercial tobacco and a creative brainstorming session about the comicl character design.

The commercial tobacco education comic book project will primary be designed for youth, with an emphasis on middle school students. The comic book series will be inspired by the stories of tribal youth that have been impacted by commercial tobacco. The comic series will also include stories from youth that respect the use of traditional tobacco and cultural values as a protective factor from commercial tobacco.

The comic strips will be available for digital publication as well as compiled into a print comic book that teachers, health educators, youth leaders, and others can use in the classroom for lessons, to hang as educational posters, or simply used as a form of entertaining reading.

FROM THE OFFICE OF THE PROJECT MANAGER Project Updates May 2023

Gymnasium Renovation Project

The Gymnasium renovations are still on schedule to be completed by June 15, 2023. Insulation was installed the week of May 15th. Window replacement began on May 25th and will take approximately two weeks. Electricians are scheduled for the first of June to complete the lighting fixtures.

Tewa Center Renovation Project

TJC Construction is currently working on completion of restroom renovations and door installations. The Tewa Center is also still on schedule to be completed by June 15, 2023.

We are planning a grand opening of both facilities and will keep the Community updated on the future event.

Povi Ka and Shumaa Po Paving Projects

Striping and speed hump installation was delayed due to weather. Striping will now take place the first of June. During the striping process, Highway Supply, Inc., will also be installing tubular markers to separate the walking path from the roadway – this will provide safety precautions for pedestrians and bicyclists.

Community Wellness Center

Anchor Engineering, LLC has been awarded the design/build contract to complete the new Center. The 30% design has been accepted. Anchor Engineering will present the design to the Tribal Council when it reaches 75%.

Tewa Tank Renovation Project

D&R Tank started the interior and exterior coating on May 15th. The project is on schedule to be completed June 8, 2023; which includes disinfection, new roof gaskets, and signage.

Phase 2 Wastewater Project

The Phase 2 of the Wastewater Project includes construction of new wastewater collection lines to connect community residents in the Pueblo South area to the current wastewater system. The pre-construction meeting was held with CF Padilla Construction on May 22, 2023. Construction will begin in June 2023 and will be an 11-month project. We will be providing the Community with a detailed construction schedule in June. Please contact the Human Resources Department for potential employment opportunities with CF Padilla.

Irrigation Equipment

The Pueblo has purchased seven irrigation pumps for residents to use. There are five ½ Hp plug in pumps and two engine driven (gas powered) pumps. There are also water hoses and hose kits. Please contact the Project Manager to check out.

Roofing Projects

The Church, Senior Program, Realty Bay, Facilities, and the Learning Center have been completed. The Administration Building is scheduled for completion the week of May 30, 2023.

Transportation Program

The Pueblo's Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) is currently being updated. Community input is needed in order to identify the Pueblo's construction projects, safety concerns, and maintenance priorities. We will be posting a survey link on the San Ildefonso Website; your participation is greatly appreciated.
