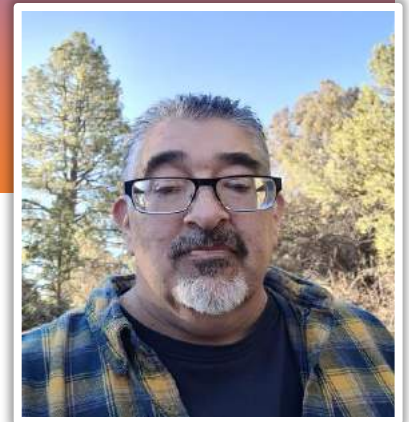
Santana Titla, LADAC

⇒ IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

We are asking the community for your patience and cooperation with the following:

- **Speed Limit** - extra works maybe on site during this time. Please slow down when entering and leaving premises.
- **Signs**—please obey all signs and closed off areas.
- **Bins**—The Recycling bin, Metal bin, E-Waste and Appliance areas will be moved **TEMPORARILY**.

⇒ OUT OF SERVICE

Our compactor that holds our household bagged waste is currently going through some electrical updates.

We are currently requesting your dispose waste into our open bin. Because of this, we are requesting your assistance, *if possible*, to hold off on disposing any large items into the open bin to allow us to accommodate the large amount of household trash collected on a daily basis.

Remember, items that can be reused can be set aside before dumping. Someone may be able to fix it or find it useful.

Dispose Your Waste Properly

The Transfer station has specific bins and areas to dispose of your waste. Here are the following areas to place your waste.



BINS:

- **GREEN** Compactor Bin = Bagged Household Waste
- **WHITE** Recycle Bin = Recyclables
- **No glass items, No trash, No food !!**
- If you have your recyclables in a plastic bag, please dump items out in bin. If you need a list of what is recyclable and what is not accepted, please stop by for one.
- **GREY** Metal Bin = scrap metal items. Dryers & Washers are accepted in the metal bin.

DESIGNATED AREAS:

- **Green Waste** = Bin located below drop off area. Trees branches, weeds, yard waste **ONLY-NO TRASH!**
- **Refrigerator & Freezers**
- **E-Waste - Electronic waste**
If your not sure where to dispose an item(s), please ask an attendant.

WE DO NOT TAKE TIRES or OIL
