NOTICE

PUEBLO DE SAN ILDEFONSO ABSENTEE VOTING

The Election Law was recently amended on July 28, 2023 and approved through Council Resolution No. SI-R23-011 to allow the Election Commission to implement Absentee Voting for enrolled tribal members who meet certain criteria. The Election Commission will be implementing the Absentee Voting process during this year's tribal elections which take place beginning with the Primary on October 28th and the General on December 1st.

ABSENTEE VOTING ELIGIBILITY. Any enrolled member of the Pueblo age eighteen (18) or older by October 28, 2023 and by December 1, 2023, who are Out-of-State College students or active in the military. This is also available for homebound seniors who are physically unable to vote at the polling place.

ABSENTEE BALLOT REQUESTS. Any enrolled member who meets the criteria described above may submit a request form (attached) to the Election Commission to receive an absentee ballot for the Primary and General Elections. Requests can be received beginning September 12, 2023.

DEADLINE TO SUBMIT. Requests for absentee ballots must be submitted on the 15th day before the Primary and General Elections. Forms can be mailed, hand-delivered to any commissioner, or e-mailed to ec@sanipueblo.org

Deadline for Primary is by **October 13, 2023** by 4:30 p.m. Deadline for General is **November 16, 2023** by 4:30 p.m.

To the community of our Po' Woh Ge Owinge:



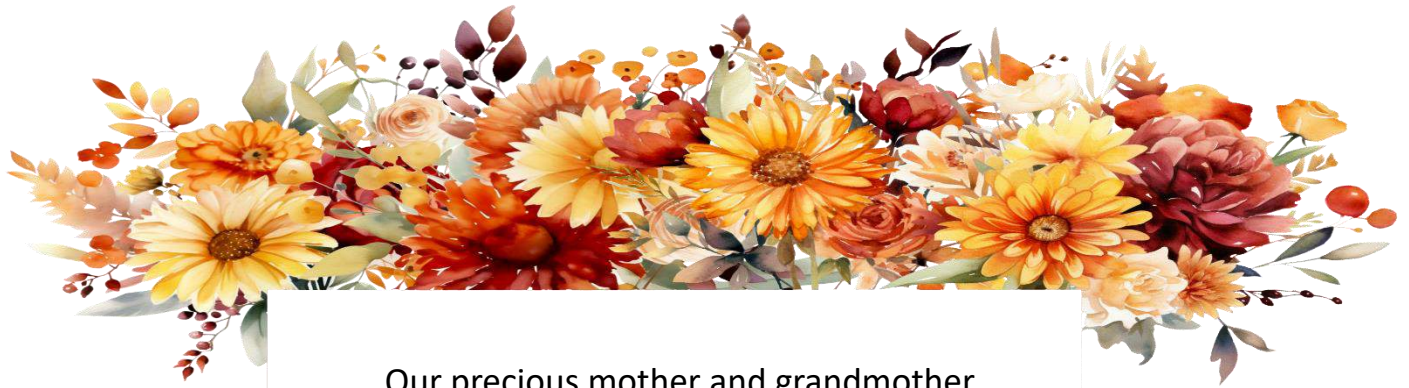

COPIING SKILLS FOR STRESS

When life gets a bit stressful it can feel overwhelming and maybe frustrating. Thankfully those feelings don't last forever because somehow, we figure out how to manage life just as it is. Here are a few suggestions on fun ways we can cope with stress.

- **Match all your socks or plastic wear with their lids**
- **Rearrange the furniture in the bedroom or living room**
- **Make a playlist of your favorite songs**
- **Grind some white corn for cornmeal**
- **Make a list of goals for the week or month**
- **Visit someone in the Pueblo**
- **Watch a movie**
- **Clean a room, your moccasins or inside your vehicle**
- **Plan an event. (birthday, dinner party or wedding)**
- **Go for a walk, a hike, a bike ride or a drive somewhere**
- **Put a puzzle together**
- **Call a supportive friend, family member or a helpline if needed**
- **Pull some weeds in the yard or repot a plant**
- **Paint.. pottery, rocks, on canvas or your nails**
- **Make a list of what you are grateful for and why**
- **Make a pie 😊**



Stress

Question: What are common stress issues you see when a crisis happens?

Answer: Signs & Symptoms associated with stress include:

- Difficulty with sleep
- Low energy and motivation
- Sadness
- Nervousness
- Difficulties with concentration
- Questioning one's abilities
- Feeling easily annoyed or irritated
-

Remember, too, that adults & children handle stress differently

A. Depending on the age and personality of your child, stress can be handled differently.

Children may show:

- Defiance
- Disrespect
- Complaining
- Fighting
- Not wanting to leave your side
- Ignoring

Question: What are some ways to stay mentally healthy during times of crisis?

Answer: One of the best things you can do is to practice self-compassion. Be nice to yourself.

- Remain hopeful as much as possible. Find things to be grateful for, start a gratitude journal.
- Use phone or computer to stay connected and balance that with when to disconnect.
- Eat healthy and exercise, find a way to make small changes like instead of having a soda with meals try water or tea.
- Get the facts but monitor the time spent watching the news
- Focus on what you can do to stay prepared for stressful events/people.
- Be fun and creative while at home.
- Setting a routine/structure to the day can combat boredom.
- Try not to smoke, drink alcohol or use drugs to deal with challenging feelings.
- Reach out.

BINS:

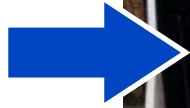
- **GREEN** Compactor Bin = Bagged Household Waste

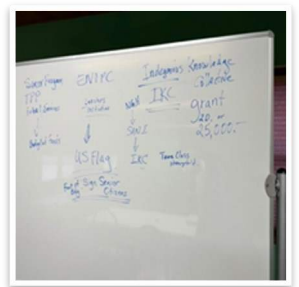
TUNYO PIN PROGRAM SEPT/OCTOBER 2023

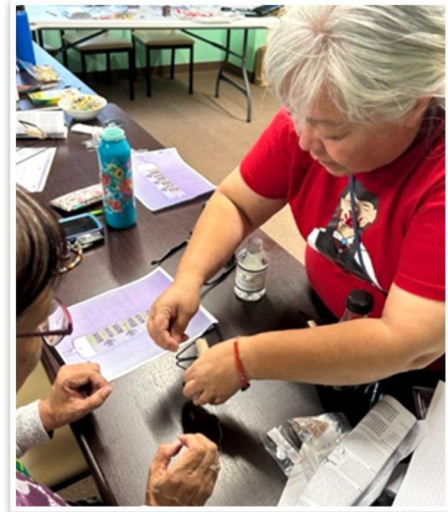
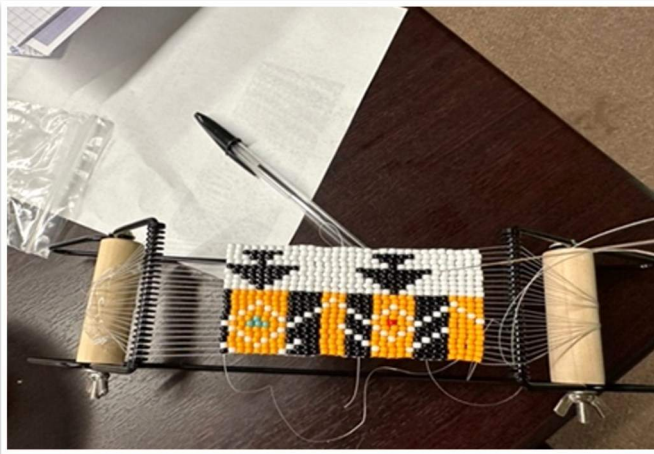

Pueblo de San Ildefonso Home Visiting Program



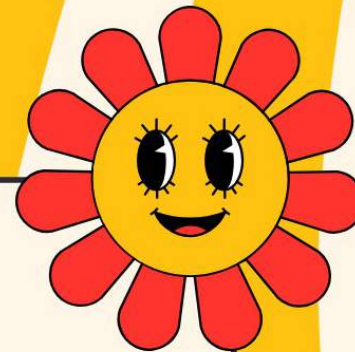

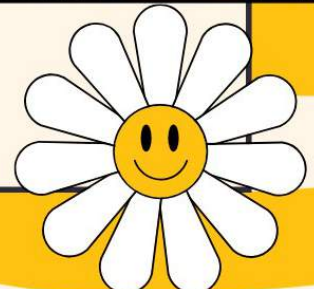

HOUSING APPLICATIONS

SIHA has received 36 applications for the Waiting List for the current Deer Tail Phase II subdivision. Most of these applicants will be referred to Homewise in Santa Fe, NM for financial literacy in preparation of mortgages. Applications are still being accepted. Applications can be filled out online at sanihousing.org or picked up from SIHA Office. Deer Tail Phase II

Deer Tail infrastructure contractor RFP has been re-advertised with a deadline of proposal submission by October 13th, due to SIHA receiving only 1 proposal that was over budget. The Deer Tail Phase II is planned for 27 homesites.

Quitclaim Deeds and Conveyance's

Ms. Carolyn Abeita, Legal Counsel submitted a letter to Superintendent McKenna to proceed with the Land Assumptions so Quit Claims may be processed, as of date SIHA met with Superintendent McKenna on Monday, September 25th, 2023 and he will be putting this matter for top priority.

SIHA received a \$45,000.00 grant from Enterprise Foundation and \$50,000.00 from Wells Fargo Invest Native. The grants will be utilized for capacity building for staff and Board members, replacing the accounting software with MIP and assistance to get SIHA finances set up in the system.

SIHA will apply for the 2023 Indian Community Development Block Grant in the amount of \$2 million for Homeownership Assistance on the Deer Tail Phase II homes, this will ensure the homes are affordable to the San Ildefonso Tribal Members.

Relentless Roofing has been working on roof repairs through the Emergency Repair Program, as of date they have completed 15 roofs and have 1 remaining. Relentless is also working on homes under the Home Improvement Program, as information this program was changed to 60/40 (SIHA pays 60% not to exceed \$9,000.00 and homeowner pays 40%). **Applications are still being accepted** and can be obtained on the SIHA website at sanihousing.org.

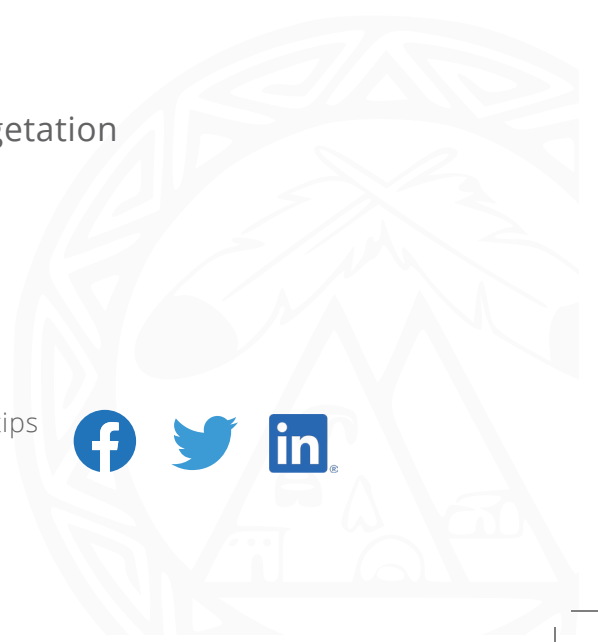

2. To receive sanitation facilities, IHS must perform a site review, verification of home construction, improvements, and availability of funds;
3. Funding for services is on a FIRST-COME-FIRST-SERVE BASIS;
4. IHS does not provide inside plumbing;
5. Under Public Law 86-121, IHS cannot own, operate or maintain the Homeowners completed facilities;
6. San Ildefonso receives an annual allocation for water/wastewater services, which varies each year. Again, the program is on a first-come-first serve basis;
7. All Homeowners applicants should coordinate the application process with the San Ildefonso Project Management Office-Mr. Lou Harrington at 455-2273. The Governor must sign and approve applications prior to submission to the Indian Health Services SFC Program; and
8. Applications can be picked up at the Tribal Office

NOTICE ON ELIGIBILITY: The applicant must be a member of a federally recognized tribe. IHS criteria states that only existing homes may be served with water and/or sewer facilities. Homes are served on a first come/first served basis. IHS is a federal agency that has restrictions on the types of homes that can be provided sanitation facility services. If a home has been built utilizing Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funds or through a HUD funded program or Tribal Housing Entity (For example: CDBG, ICDBG) it is possible that the home may NOT be eligible for service from IHS. A home built by HUD funds cannot receive IHS services due to IHS regulations. The homeowner should be aware of what program, if any is responsible for funding the construction of their home in lieu of the above restriction.

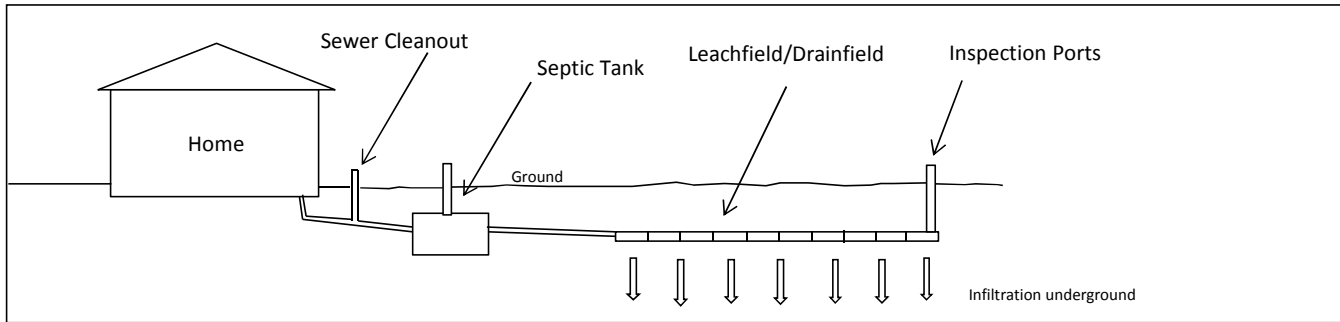

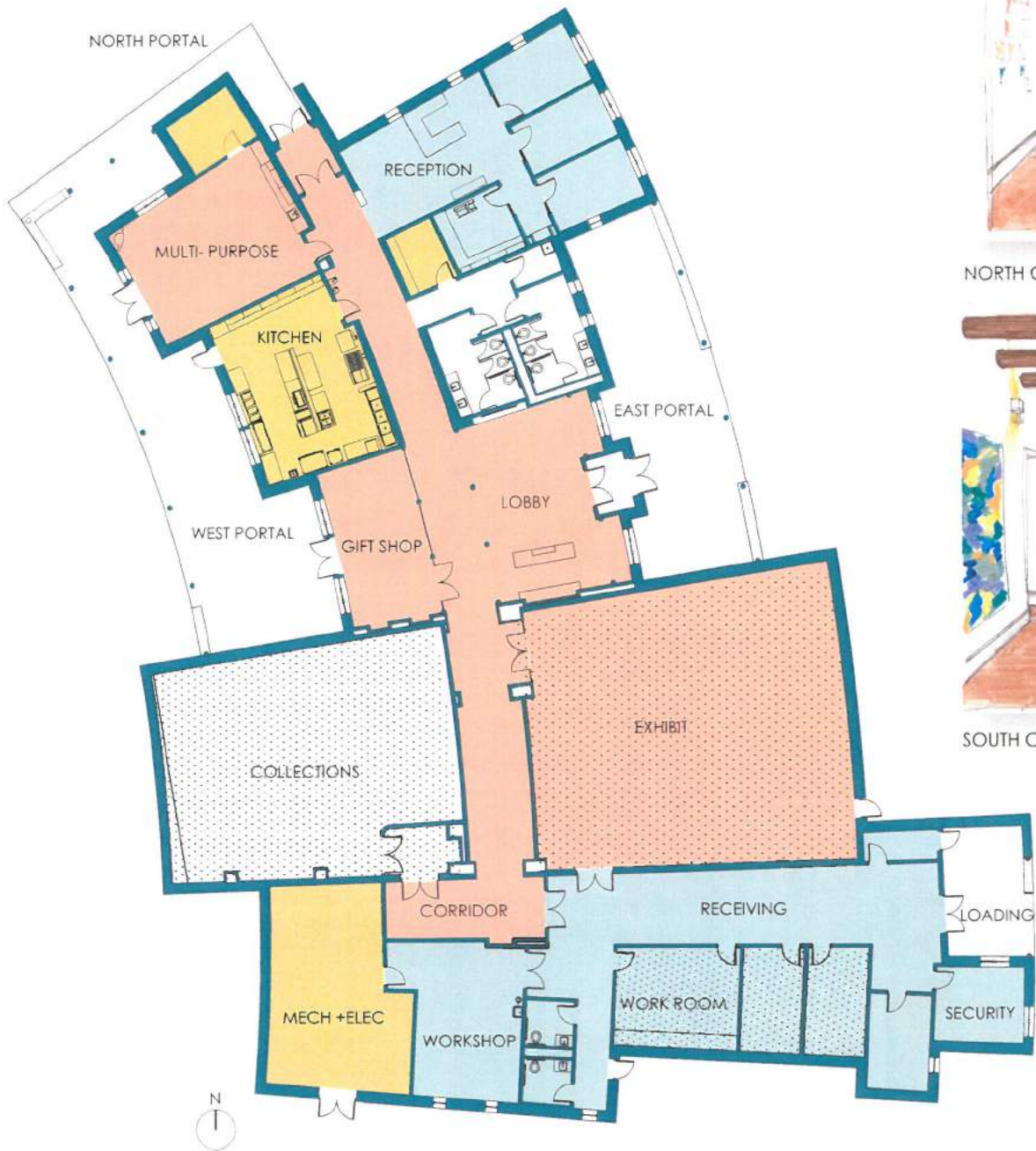
