

> from the Indigenous Resilience Center at the University of Arizona.




This prestigious honorary award recognizes outstanding individuals making a positive impact in tribal communities to create healthy environments.

An award ceremony was held at the 2024 Southwest Adapation Forum on Tuesday, February 27th, 2024.

The vision of Indigenous Resilience Center (IRes) is that we see a world in which Indigenous communities are thriving and adaptable to meet environmental and societal challenges. IRes is supported by the University of Arizona, the Agnese Nelms Haury Program in Environment and Social Justice and Arizona Institute for Resilience. In our work, we partner with Native Nations in community-driven projects to co-design tribal resilience solutions. His broad experience of Forest Service Technician, and Tribal Risk Assessment Technician to serving the Pueblo in many different capacities is part of what makes him a successful Director. As the current Director of the Environment Department, he is prioritizing continuous monitoring of the Chromium plume and providing accurate and frequent communications to Pueblo residents and Tribal Council.

Hello my name is Sheldon Pena, So 'Ku'wah.



Project Management Update

The Pueblo received a grant from Indian Health Services (IHS) to install water meters at each home and each Tribal building. This will help Pueblo Facilities staff diagnose leaks or other deficiencies in our water distribution system.

This activity will occur in two (2) Phases.

Phase 1 Water Meter Inventory:

The Pueblo will soon be hiring a contractor for Phase 1 Water Meter Inventory. The contractor will locate and map water service connections and service lines at every home throughout the Pueblo. The contactor will be accompanied by an escort from the Facilities Department who will attempt to coordinate with each homeowner prior to commencement of work.

Phase 2 Water Meter Installation:

The Pueblo will hire a contractor for Phase 2 Water Meter Installation. The contactor will install water meters following the initial inventory and mapping work completed in Phase 1. The contractor will be accompanied by an escort from the Facilities Department who will attempt to coordinate with each homeowner as the work approaches.

Therefore, a contractor and an escort from the Facilities Department will most likely be in your neighborhood or yard within the next 60 days to start Phase 1.

Thank you for your cooperation, as we move forward, to improve our water distribution system.





HOUSING APPLICATIONS

SIHA needs your help in justifying the need for housing on the San Ildefonso Pueblo, SIHA staff would like to begin the process of planning for Multi-Housing (apartments), however with the current 46 applications submitted are for consideration for the Deer Tail Phase II subdivision Without application numbers SIHA is unable to justify the need in grant applications, the SIHA applications have been updated to indicate whether you are applying for a rental or homeownership unit.

Applications can be filled out online or picked up from SIHA. An application is attached.

SUCCESSOR FORMS

SIHA encourages homeowners to complete a successor form for their private home and provide a copy to SIHA, San Ildefonso Realty and most importantly to a family member who you trust. THE FORM MUST BE NOTARIZED AND THE SUCCESSOR MUST BE A SAN ILDEFONSO TRIBAL MEMBER. See attached Successor Form.

Maintenance on Private Homes

It is the homeowner's responsibility for maintenance on their home, SIHA is not obligated to pay or to provide any Maintenance of the home. Currently SIHA will assist for emergency (health and safety) home maintenance issues during regular working hours of 7:30 a.m. -4:00p.m., there may be a cost to the homeowner due to current operating funding is specifically for units under management.

SIHA does not have a Maintenance Department; Mr. Christopher Romero is the only employee.

I completed the Financial Fitness class what's next?

SIHA in collaboration with Homewise will host a Homebuyer Education class that is also mandatory for applicants, at that time it is up to the applicant to sign up with Homewise to get the ball rolling if they interested in a mortgage home at the Deer Tail Phase II subdivision.

What if I'm not ready for a mortgage and I miss out on Deer Tail Phase II?

SIHA encourages you to work with Homewise to come up with a plan of action to be mortgage ready. SIHA will plan for future housing, as information if you have a homesite you may build there as well. Any future home projects will be through grant applications, SIHA will do their best to submit awarded grant applications but may not always be awarded. Grant application competition is throughout Indian country.

What if I don't want to work with Homewise and want to work with a mortgage company of my choice?

You are welcome to work with whoever you want, SIHA is doing their part in collaborating with others to help Tribal Members be mortgage ready.






