Tribal Members,

Please be informed that we have been made aware that the Santa Clara IHS Health Clinic is temporarily suspending Pharmacy services due to shortage of staffing. Governor Moquino has communicated directly with Acting CEO Adcock and AAIHS Director Dr. Thomas on the importance and impact of the disruption of services. Regional Tribal leadership is meeting with Dr. Tso and IHS representatives to discuss the interim remedies to address this. Our Health and Human Service department is actively working on how to best coordinate our efforts to make regular access and pick-up of medications scheduled appropriately. We understand the frustration and anxiousness this can and will cause. It is our hope that this will be short stint and regular services will continue

During this temporary closure, please call Santa Fe IHS Pharmacy for your medication refills. Their number is (505)946-9376. The San Ildefonso Pueblo CHR Program will be doing medication pick-up on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons. Reminder that all refills require a 48-hour notification.

Once a candidate is sworn in as a Representative, the Representative shall have thirty days to establish residency within the exterior boundaries of the Pueblo as defined at the time of the adoption of this Agreement.

Certification of Candidate Qualifications

By signing below, I hereby certify that I meet the qualifications for elective office, and that upon election to office, I will follow the requirements for office including any requirement to establish my residency within the exterior boundaries of the Pueblo.

Under the Amended Election Law: Article III – Nominations; Section 1. Nominations, A Self – Nomination, 1. Any qualified member of the pueblo may submit his or her name in writing to the Election Commission as a candidate for elective office, along with a non-refundable fee of \$25.00.

Consent to a Criminal Background Check

I understand that the background investigation will include criminal record history, whether or not such information would otherwise be protected from disclosure by any constitutional, statutory or common law privilege.

I hereby agree to accept all risks of adverse public notice that may result from use of information obtained in connection with this criminal background investigation. I hereby agree to indemnify and hold harmless any person to whom this is lawfully presented and his agent and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including reasonable attorney fees, arising out or by reason of complying with this request.

Vibration Monitoring is coming!

Construction of the Pojoaque Basin Regional Water System (PBRWS) project will begin in your neighborhood in the near future.

This is a U.S. Department of the Interior (US DOI) and Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) construction project contracted to CDM Smith Constructors, Inc.

As part of the PBRWS project, it will be necessary to perform **pre-construction condition surveys** on selected structures, adjacent to construction areas within the Pueblo boundaries.

The **pre-construction condition surveys** will collect data about the condition of selected structures through visual inspection, digital photography, and videos to document any pre-existing cosmetic or structural conditions outside of the structures. This will include any cracks in walls and other defects caused by normal aging and environmental forces.

CDM Smith Constructors, Inc. pays for this vibration monitoring survey. All photographs taken will remain with the project engineer (BOR) in strict confidence. They will be maintained for three years, and then destroyed.

Please keep in mind, construction methods and equipment planned for use by CDM Constructors, Inc. will not cause cracking to your property. These surveys are intended for your security and to document the pre-construction condition of your building(s).

The **pre-construction condition survey** gives you an opportunity to talk with the project engineer about your role in the project and what to expect during the construction process.

The survey should take less than an hour and you need to be present with the contractor and Tribal Official.

A Tribal Official will contact you to schedule an appointment.

Pojoaque Basin Regional Water System (PBRWS)

The Pojoaque Basin Regional Water System (PBRWS) is an important part of the Aamodt Settlement Agreement and will divert water from the Rio Grande. It includes a water treatment facility, along with storage tanks, pump stations, and transmission and distribution pipelines. As part of the project, vibration-monitoring activities will be undertaken to protect the property owner from any damage caused during construction.

Below is a list of frequently asked questions (FAQs) about vibration monitoring.

1. What is Vibration Monitoring?

Vibration monitoring consists of three (3) parts:

1. Risk survey: A condition survey of any structures or sensitive features within the construction area. This survey includes the vibration monitor to visit, make note of any existing cracks or damage to a structure, and take pictures of the structure to document the current conditions of the structure.
2. Digital Video Recording: The vibration monitor will walk the pipeline corridor recording the existing roads, exteriors of structures such as walls and building, and existing *acequias* and arroyos prior to construction.
3. Seismic monitoring: The vibration monitor will use seismographs to record any ground vibrations that occur due to the equipment used during construction. This information is used to determine the distance needed between the equipment and any structures to prevent damage.

2. What is vibration monitoring used for?

a. Vibration monitoring is used to protect the property owner from any damage being caused during construction. Risk Surveys are intended for your security and provide you with an understanding of the pre-construction condition of your building. This is an opportunity to talk about the scope of work for this project and what to expect during the construction.

3. How is vibration monitoring performed?

a. After the risk surveys and digital video recordings are performed, seismographs are used to monitor ground vibrations and noise during heavy equipment operations to ensure vibration levels remain well below safe guidelines that will protect your property from potential damage. The use of seismographs will also serve as a check on compliance with safe vibration standards. Please do not be alarmed if you see these orange boxes placed temporarily around the Pueblo.

4. Why was my home selected and not others?

a. Only structures within 80 ft from this pipeline corridor were identified as good candidates for a structure survey. During this survey, our engineers take digital photographs outside of your structure(s) to document existing cracks and other defects that have been caused by normal aging and environmental forces.

5. How long will the survey take?

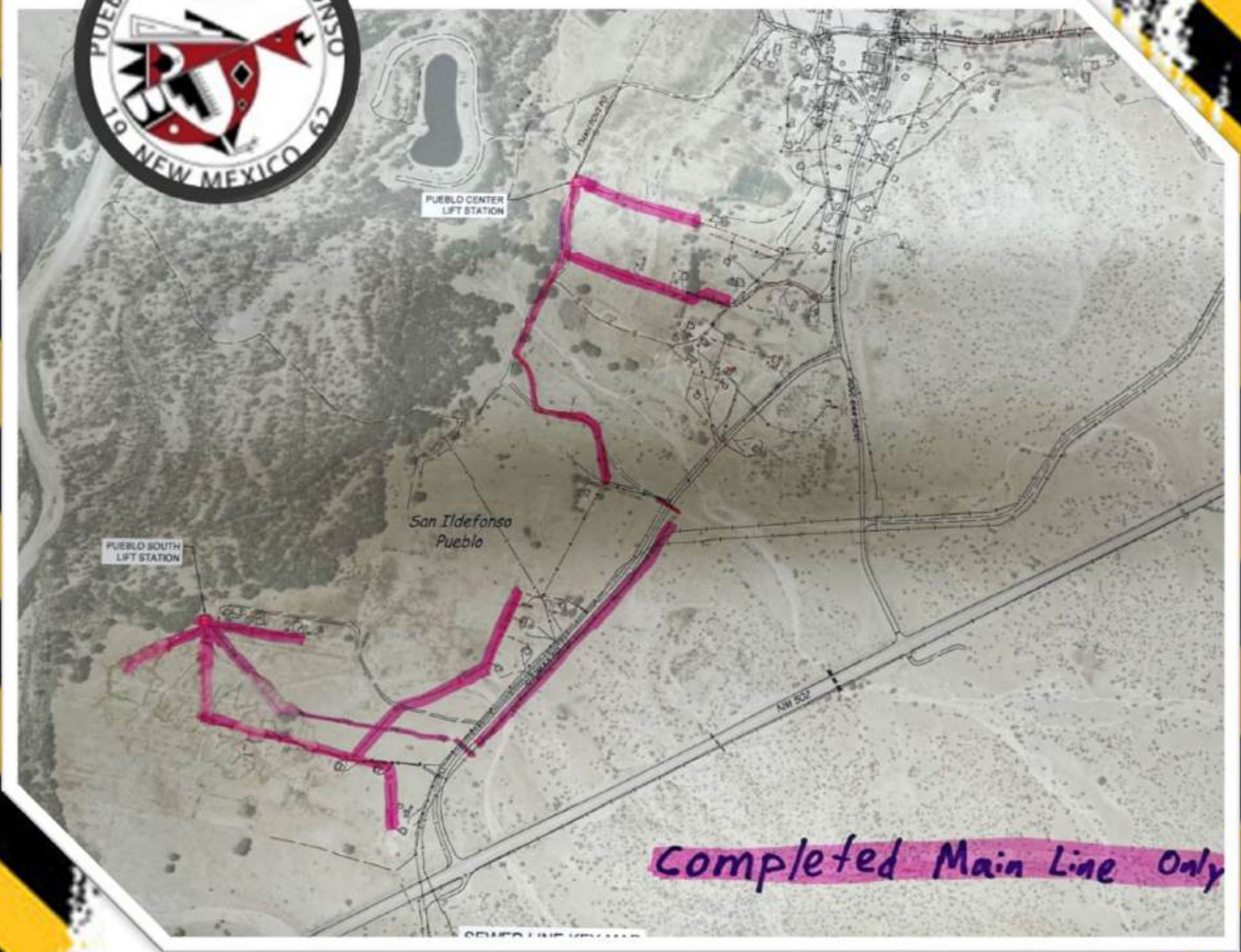
a. The survey should take less than half an hour. The photographs will remain in strict confidence with J. Aimone Associates and with the Pueblo.

Current pipeline construction schedule

The pipeline subcontractor CF Padilla will mobilize on September 9th. They will work on tanks and other sites prior to working close to the Main Plaza. The subcontractor estimates to be at the Plaza between March and May 2025.

Currently, CF Padilla, contractor, for the Waste Water Phase 2 project has completed about 95% of the project. Approximately five (5) miles of sewer lines were installed (including 8-inch PVC gravity sewer line, 4-inch PVC SDR-26 sewer service lines, 1.5-inch and 3-inch HDPE DR 17 sewer force main).

Manholes and cleanouts were installed along the sewer lines in accordance with the project design. Sewer services have been extended to thirty-four (34) home and two (2) tribal facilities. Existing septic tanks for the 36 facilities were pumped empty, demolished, filled with sand and abandoned. Two (2) lift stations were also installed as part of the project.

The wastewater collected from the project is being pumped through the new lift stations into the existing lagoons.

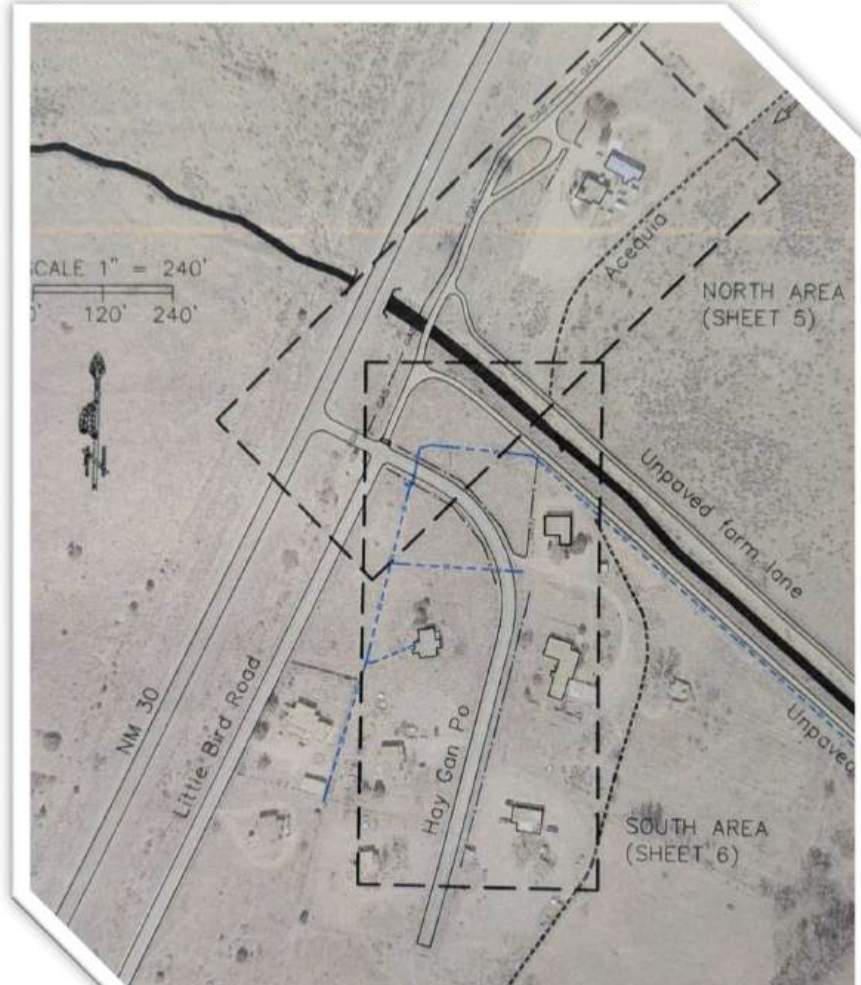

Hay Gan Po Water Main Extension is Complete!



On June 24, 2024, J&D Contracting Company began construction of the Hay Gan Po Water Main Extension project in the Pajarito neighborhood of San Ildefonso Pueblo. The project installed new water pipelines along Hay Gan Po and Little Bird Road and connected six (6) homes to the Pueblo's community water system.

Connecting the homes to the Pueblo's water system provides the residents with safe, treated water, so that they do not have to rely on their individual on-site wells. Testing of some of the wells in this area detected arsenic, iron and turbidity at levels that San Ildefonso's Facilities Department was concerned about. Construction took approximately less than two (2) months.

The project was designed by the U.S. Indian Health Service's (IHS) Santa Fe District Office. The approximately \$266,000.00 project cost is funded by grants from IHS and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

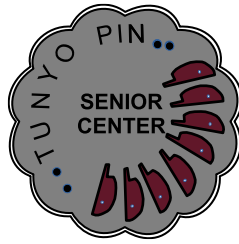

September is National Recovery Month, and it is a time to reflect and celebrate recovery from addiction, mental health issues, or both! Did you know that most people recover from addiction and mental health challenges. If we look at data from the 2021 National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH), it shows that 70 million adults aged 18 or older perceived that they ever had a substance use and/or mental health problem.

For substance use specifically, of the 29.0 million adults who perceived that they ever had a substance use problem, **72.2%** (or 20.9 million) considered themselves to be in recovery or to have recovered from their drug or alcohol use problem. For mental health, of the 58.7 million adults who perceived they ever had a mental health problem, **66.5%** (or 38.8 million) considered themselves to be in recovery or to have recovered from their mental health problem.

The truth is that someone sitting next to you at work is likely to be in recovery, as is your boss, or your boss's boss. The person writing this article is in recovery from both addiction and mental health challenges. We do recover, and many of us, choose to help other people find that recovery. But what is *recovery* exactly?

Recovery is hard to define, and each person is allowed to live their own version of recovery. For many people with addictions, it means that they no longer use intoxicating substances, and they continually try to improve themselves and repair the harm that they have caused. For persons in recovery from mental health issues recovery can mean that they have learned to accept and manage their symptoms, and many live with time periods when they have no symptoms at all.

How can you move towards recovery? Think of it as a long journey and the only way to go down that road is to start walking, take those first few steps. Don't wait for it to be a perfect day, or for the perfect shoes, or for someone to walk with you. Just get up, open the door, face the rain and take some steps forward. Congratulations, you are now on the road towards recovery!
