Mr. Lou Harrington is now the Pueblo's Project Manager. He has been with the Pueblo off and on doing project management for the last 4 years.


Construction updates:

October Waterline construction.

- 1) The construction by the administration building will cut across Tunyo Po and only one lane will remain open. Traffic will be controlled by flaggers. The construction will end temporarily in the vicinity of the gym.
- 2) The construction by the senior center road will continue south and eventually cut across Tunyo Po. The Senior center, HHS offices and mail boxes will remain open. Flaggers will control traffic as construction nears crossing Tunyo Po.
- 3) Construction will continue near the Pajarito water tank.
- 4) Clearing and grubbing in the El Rancho pond area may start in October.
- 5) The museum is temporarily closed to prevent any damage to displays from construction vibration. All items have been packed away.

Wastewater construction.

- 1) The last remaining item of <u>Wastewater II</u> is the application of base coarse on Than Povi Po. This will begin the latter part of the week of Sept. 29th. The road will not be closed unless it is necessary. The material will fix the problem of the road becoming impassable whenever it rains or snows.
- 2) <u>Wastewater III</u> entails fixing/replacing the lagoons. The Wastewater Treatment Project will consist of installing an Orenco Advantex® treatment system.
 - The treatment system will be similar to the current treatment system in the Pajarito/Battleship Mountain housing area.
 - The project will use an updated Orenco AX-Max treatment unit.
 - The new treatment system is expected to benefit 118 homes and 9 tribal facilities and businesses. The system can be expanded to accommodate future growth.
 - Begin Construction February/March 2026
 - Complete Construction Fall 2026

Best Way to Recycle Halloween Pumpkins



The best way to recycle Halloween pumpkins is to **reuse them** for various purposes, such as making pumpkin puree, roasting pumpkin seeds, or composting them. Here are some of the best methods to recycle your pumpkins

- Make Pumpkin Puree: Use <u>uncarved</u> pumpkins to make fresh pumpkin puree, which can be used in recipes or stored in the freezer for later use.
- <u>Roast Pumpkin Seeds</u>: Roast pumpkin seeds for a crunchy snack or add them to baked goods.
- <u>Compost:</u> Compost pumpkins to enrich your garden soil, as they are nutrient-rich.
- <u>Donate to Community Gardens</u>: Donate uncarved pumpkins to local community gardens for composting and growing more food.



Na-vi Po'-woh-geh Towa-in,

We will again start some Tewa Language classes come this month, starting on October 7, 2025 at 6pm for all who are interested in learning your language, for those of ages 15 and up. They will be conducted during the evenings, twice a week at the DECP Conference Room (for the women) and the Health and Wellness Center (for men). Of these two classes (for now), once you come to the class, you will decide with the mentors when times are best for your days to have your languages classes.

I would hope that some of you will be interested in coming to the classes. As many of you know, we <u>PO NOT</u> want our language to go silent. Its up to us who know the language and to talk to this generation and the generations yet to come, to make sure we keep our language alive and well. This is what identifies us as Po'-woh-geh Towa in'. And we should be proud of who we are and where we come from. So please if you have relatives that speak our Tewa tun, please, please...tell them to speak to you in Tewa, and if they forget, remind them. We and they need to hold ourselves accountable, to make sure it is spoken in the homes and in our traditions, so that everyone will start speaking our language slowly and can then pass that on to our next generation. <u>Very important!!</u>

I need a count of how many are interested, so in case I need another class. PS: We certainly do not want what happened at the CADDO NATION in Oklahoma someday (see attached). This is sad, when it gets to this point!!

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS:

Julie Sanchez, Chair Shannon Titla, Vice Chair Victoria Martinez, Secretary Danielle Keener-Garcia, Treasurer Kevin Naranjo, Member **Board of Commissioners** – Two (2) Board of Commissioner terms will end on December 31, 2025, if you are interested in becoming a Board member you may submit a letter of interest and resume to Kitty Montoya, Executive Assistant to Governor Moquino. Deadline to submit: November 14, 2025

Section 3 – Membership Qualifications.

- a. Board members may be tribal members or non-tribal members.
- b. No person may be prohibited from serving as a member of the Board because that person is also a tenant or Homebuyer of Housing. There is an exception to this rule. Anyone who is delinquent on housing payments due to the authority is ineligible to serve of the Board.
- c. A Board member may participate in all meetings concerning matters that affect all of the tenants or Homebuyers even though those matters may indirectly affect the Board member as well; however, no Board member, in their capacity as a member of the Board, may participate in or be present at any Board meeting concerning any matter involving the Board member's individual rights, obligations, or status as a tenant or Homebuyer, except that the Board member may participate in or be present at such meeting only in their capacity as a tenant or Homebuyer.
- d. Board members must be at least 18 years of age.
- e. Board members may not be convicted felons.

HOUSING APPLICATIONS:

SIHA waiting list applications are available for tribal members to grow its waiting list, the waiting list is essential for SIHA to pursue grant opportunities and to assess housing needs effectively. SIHA encourages tribal members to visit the SIHA Office during business hours or email director@sanihousing.org to collect an application.

A letter dated September 10, 2025, was mailed requesting updated income verification that included your last two paycheck stubs or 2024 IRS Tax Return. Deadline was October 1, 2025, however as of to date SIHA received One (1) response, therefore an extension will be given until *October 10, 2025*. 
