Special Bulletin - Pueblo de San Ildefonso Feast Day

This year, the Pueblo de San Ildefonso will be celebrating our Annual Feast day. Both Kivas will be busy with traditional activities. We remind all to be respectful and aware of your surroundings. The Executive Order will remain in place with the exception of the allowance of visitors to partake in our Feast respectfully on January 22nd and 23rd. All members and visitors, please honor and be mindful when visiting family homes and understand the safety precautions they ask to be followed. We strongly encourage wearing masks indoors and practicing social distancing when possible. High rates of flu, respiratory illnesses and Covid are still impacting our Pueblo and State. Governor Moquino and the Tribal Council wish you all a Happy and Healthy 2023 and many blessings for all our people this coming Feast Day.

ZERO TOLERANCE

The Governor has ordered that a Zero Tolerance policy shall be effective beginning Monday, January 16, 2023 through Monday, January 24, 2023. Violation of the Zero Tolerance order, which also includes underage drinking will not be tolerated. Any liquor or drug related violations will result in immediate incarceration and will be handled only after all traditional activities have been completed. All law Enforcement Officers will take any means necessary to enforce this policy.

CELL PHONE/CAMERAS PROHIBITED

No cell phones, cameras, recording devices or sketching are allowed during Feast Day within the Pueblo Proper. No recording or photography is allowed. Anyone caught using a cell phone or camera will have the device confiscated and turned into the Governor's Office. This includes all DRONES. Owners can request the confiscated devices at the Governor's Office Tuesday, January 24, 2023 after 9:00 a.m. This prohibition applies to everyone – tribal members and visitors alike. FEAST DAY TRAFFIC CONTROL

The gate on Agoyo Po will be closed to all traffic. The gate will be locked and signs will be placed to direct traffic. Povi Kaa will also be closed except for residents only. All traffic will be directed through Than Povi Po, east to the designated parking area below the Governor's Office. Tribal members will have access to the Pueblo through Than Povi Po and to Black Mesa housing through Tunyo Po. Bus and large vehicle parking will be at the gym and the baseball fields.

In addition, traffic control near traditional areas will be monitored by the traditional leaders. Please respect their decisions and authority. No parking in front of the church or sectioned area. All parking violators will be towed.
