PUEBLO DE SAN ILDEFONSO GENERAL ELECTION

DATE: FRIDAY, DECEMBER 1, 2023

TIME: 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

POLLING PLACE: LEARNING CENTER/LIBRARY

VOTER REGISTRATION IS NOT REQUIRED. Any enrolled member of the Pueblo age eighteen (18) or older by December 1, 2023, is eligible to vote inperson at the polling place during voting hours. Absentee voting will be permitted in this year's Election for those that meet the eligibility criteria.

While the polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., no persons except members of the Election Commission shall be allowed to remain within fifty (50) feet of the polling place. Campaigning is not allowed within fifty (50) feet of the polling place.

Voting Safety

While we encourage everyone to exercise your right to vote, it is everyone's responsibility to take the Pueblo's public health orders and safety precautions seriously in order to protect yourself and others in your family and community from contracting the COVID-19 virus.

Masks and gloves are optional while participating in the voting process but they are encouraged. If you are in line at 7:00 p.m., you will be allowed to vote.

Ballot Instructions

Eligible Voters will be allowed the following number of votes for the General Election:

- Up to one (1) Vote for Governor
- Up to three (3) Votes for Council Representatives
- If you mark **more** than the allowed number of votes for a position then that section of the ballot will be considered spoiled and your vote will not be counted. If you mark **less** than the number of Pueblo de San Ildefonso Election Commissioners or Council Representatives of votes you are allowed for a position, only those votes that was marked will be counted, and that section will be valid.

NO WRITE-IN CANDIDATES WILL BE ALLOWED. If you write-in a candidate for a position then that section of the ballot will be considered spoiled and your vote will not be counted.

Background Check Reports

As required by the Governing Agreement, a criminal background check has been conducted on all candidates for elective office. 

HOUSING APPLICATIONS

SIHA has received 36 applications for the Waiting List for the current Deer Tail Phase II subdivision. Most of these applicants will be referred to Homewise in Santa Fe, NM for financial literacy in preparation for mortgages. Applications are still being accepted. Applications can be filled out online or picked up from SIH.

If you need assistance in filling out the application or have questions you may contact Devan Martinez, Housing Manager at the SIHA Office.

HOMEWISE

SIHA is in partner with Homewise for Homebuyer Education and Financial Fitness classes to be offered to San Ildefonso Tribal Members. All SIHA waiting list applicants will be required to attend and complete the 6-hour course. An announcement will be made on the date and time for these classes.

Deer Tail Phase II

SIHA received 1 proposal from CF Padilla for the Deer Tail Infrastructure contractor and is negotiating the cost per line item. SIHA is planning on awarding the contract within 30-days. The Deer Tail Phase II is planned for 27 homesites.

Quitclaim Deeds and Conveyance's

SIHA submitted the required documents to proceed to the next step in acquiring the Master Leases for all housing projects on the San Ildefonso Pueblo. Once the Master Leases are approved by the BIA Southwest Regional Office SIHA will prepare Quit Claims for the homes that are eligible for conveyance.

SIHA was not given an estimated time of turnaround..

Relentless Roofing has been working on roof repairs through the Emergency Repair Program, as of date they have completed 18 roofs and have 5 pending. Relentless is also working on homes under the Home Improvement Program, as information this program was changed to 60/40 (SIHA pays 60% not to exceed \$9,000.00 and homeowner pays 40%).

Native American Natural Resource Research Scholarship



The Intertribal Timber Council (ITC), in partnership with the USDA Forest Service Research and Development is pleased to announce scholarship opportunities for Native American students who are planning or currently conducting tribally relevant research in a natural resource issue.

Deadline: December 1, 2023, 5:00 p.m. PST

Award: Varies, not to exceed \$5,000

Purpose: The ITC Research Scholarship is designed to support tribally relevant, natural resource-based research being conducted by Native American scholars enrolled in a graduate program.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS: The ITC Education Selection Committee will review and rank only those applications that completely address the following criteria:

1. **Letter of Application:** The letter must include your name, permanent mailing address, email address and phone number. Discuss your current educational program and how the tribally relevant proposed research fits into both your degree in natural resources and your future.

2. Resume

- 4. **Mini Research Proposal:** Please keep this concise, 4 page maximum not counting budget and justification. Required elements include:
 - a. Abstract stating research merit and explaining how this research is relevant to tribal natural resource interests.
 - b. Timeline and methodology.
 - c. Dissemination plan, including a tribal component.
 - d. Budget and budget justification.
- 5. **Letters of Reference/Support**. Letters of reference are not accepted directly from referrals, submit with your completed application.
 - a. A letter of reference/support from an academic advisor or committee member is required.
 - b. A second letter of support from a tribal resource manager or a tribal representative with tribal approval of the project or the relevancy of the project to the tribe is required.

TRUMAN D. PICARD (1946-1986)

To honor Truman D. Picard the ITC established a scholarship program in his name. Truman served on the ITC Board of Directors from 1982 to 1985. While working for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Colville Agency, in presales he attended the Forest Engineering Institute at Oregon State University becoming one of the first people from the agency to complete this program. In 1977, Truman transferred to the Colville Tribal Forestry organization taking a position as Supervisory Forest Technician in charge of woods operations. Later he was promoted to Assistant Supervisor of Forestry Operations. Because of his drive and determination to complete his education Truman returned to Oregon State University earning a Bachelor of Science Degree in Forest Management. Upon his return from college, he was appointed Director of Colville Tribal Forestry. His work for the Tribe will always be remembered by his individual efforts to bring BIA Forestry and Colville Tribal Forestry together in a joint effort to improve the level of Forest Management on the reservation – truly a lasting legacy.
