Cultural Heritage Opportunities

Want to learn more about San Ildefonso's history and heritage. Come out and learn by visiting Ancestral cultural sites on the Pajarito Plateau.

- **Site Assessments:** throughout the summer, we are visiting with Bandelier National Monument archaeologists as they assess the condition of cultural sites at Tsankawi and Frijoles Canyon. Come join us for a backcountry walk and look at these undisturbed areas. Visits to these sites will be throughout the next three months. Contact me for available dates and more information.
- **June 14, June 28, and July 19, 9:00 am to 12:00 pm,** we are arranging three separate half-day trips to little-visited cultural sites on DOE lands. The hikes will be differing degrees of difficulty adjusted for who is going. June 14 will be Tsirege and the Comet site. Tsirege is a large village (800 rooms) where San I ancestors lived approximately 1325-1600 and probably reoccupied following the Spanish re-conquest. The Comet site is notable for its rock art depiction of a 14th century comet.
- **Employment Opportunities:** Be outdoors, learning about cultural sites, and meaningful types of work. Positions require no prior work experience needed. Walk and record sites with a team of people, no excavation. Help bring change to archaeology by becoming involved.
 - Archaeology Techs. Work with DOE or Bandelier archaeologists, full and part time opportunities available
 - Cultural Monitors. Work on tribal lands to monitor construction helping to identify and protect cultural sites.

Enrollment Office

Tribal ID's

The printing of ID's will be on hold until June 17, 2024. We are in the process of installing new enrollment software and setting up new identification cards. Also, a reminder that ID's are only done by appointment and same day appointments are not guaranteed. Please call ahead using the number or email below.

The current ID's that you have are still be valid until the expiration date on the card. Moving forward, ID's issued will have a new design and a new cost.

- If you are **renewing** your ID that has expired or is about to expire (within a month before expiration date), there will be a \$10 charge.
- If you are **replacing** an ID that is **lost** or **not** expired (earlier than a month before expiration date), there will be a \$15 charge. Dates of when IDs are made are shown on software.
- ID's for minors (17 and under) will still be free.
- Cash or checks will be accepted.

New Enrollment

Enrollment Packets can be picked up at the Tribal Admin Building or they can be found on sanipueblo.org. Go to Programs- Tribal Services- Enrollment. Please allow us time to process enrollment packets. Once a decision has been made, you will receive a call from our office informing you of the status of the application.

Current requirements to be eligible for enrollment:

- At least one parent must be enrolled with San Ildefonso Pueblo.
- Applicant must be at least ¼ Indian Blood.
- Cannot be enrolled in another Tribe. If you are, you must show proof of relinquishment process from current enrolled tribe.

Climate change projections indicate more severe temperature increases and drier conditions in the future, which may adversely affect the Pueblo de San Ildefonso community in many different ways. One such impact may be an increase in extreme wildfire events. Because of concerns about this impact, the Pueblo is currently assessing wildfire risk on the Pueblo to prioritize future wildfire mitigation actions. As part of this risk assessment, the Pueblo is holding workshops with Pueblo members to better understand wildfire risks and mitigation priorities.

We are interested in YOUR participation in three upcoming virtual community workshops!

During the first workshop, we will discuss how wildfire risk may affect the Pueblo and key areas that may be vulnerable to wildfire impacts. This workshop will help the Pueblo plan for wildfire mitigation actions to protect essential components of Pueblo life.

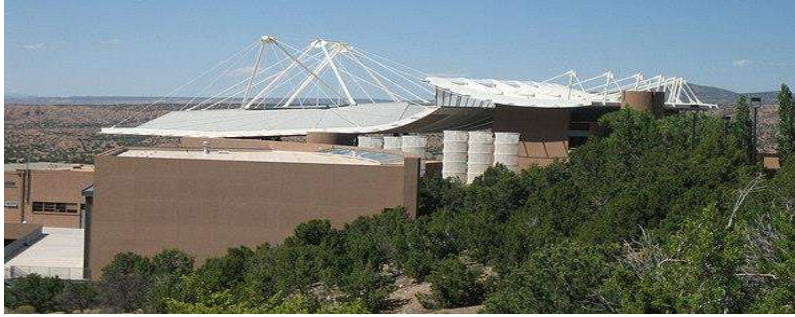

QUITCLAIM DEEDS

SIHA is currently awaiting the return of nine signed and notarized Quitclaims, thus far nine Quitclaims have been delivered to the Northern Pueblo Agency Realty Office. It is important to emphasize that you have been waiting for years to receive your Quit Claim, and SIHA is making every effort to ensure that you receive it in a timely manner. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

AMERIND INSURANCE

If your home is eligible for conveyance or in the Quit Claim process your insurance under SIHA will expire on 12/31/24. SIHA recommends you obtain insurance before the expiration date. Per the SIHA Policy and the Pueblo de San Ildefonso Code, SIHA is committed to ensuring that all pets are securely enclosed or restrained and have been registered with the Animal Control Officer. Any vehicles that are not functioning and are not registered will be required to be removed from the premises.

Maintenance on Private Homes

It is the homeowner's responsibility for maintenance on their home, SIHA is not obligated to pay or to provide any maintenance to the home. SIHA may assist for emergency (health and safety) home maintenance issues during regular working hours of 7:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m., there may be a cost to the homeowner due to current operating funding is specifically for units under management.

SIHA does not have a Maintenance Department; however, Christopher Romero is the only employee who will respond to emergency calls.

CF Padilla completed installation of the sewer lines the last week of May and are on schedule for waterline installation. CF Padilla has ongoing dirt and water hauling to complete the grading, please be vigilant for those trucks moving on and off the main road.

Currently, CF Padilla, contractor, for the Waste Water Phase 2 project has completed the installation of approximately 4.4 miles of sewer line.

New sewer service will be extended to thirty-nine (39) existing homes and four (4) Tribal facilities. Existing septic tanks at these locations will be pumped out, demolished, backfilled with sand and abandoned.

The project is currently about 60% complete. The system will also include two (2) lift stations: one at the Pueblo South area, and one within the Pueblo Center area. The wastewater will be pumped into existing lagoons located west of Than Povi Po and the Tribal Administration Building.

The alignment of the new wastewater collection lines will follow along existing roads to the extent possible. Once all the sewer main lines have been installed and the lift station is operational, CF Padilla, contractor, will return to each home and install the sewer service lines.

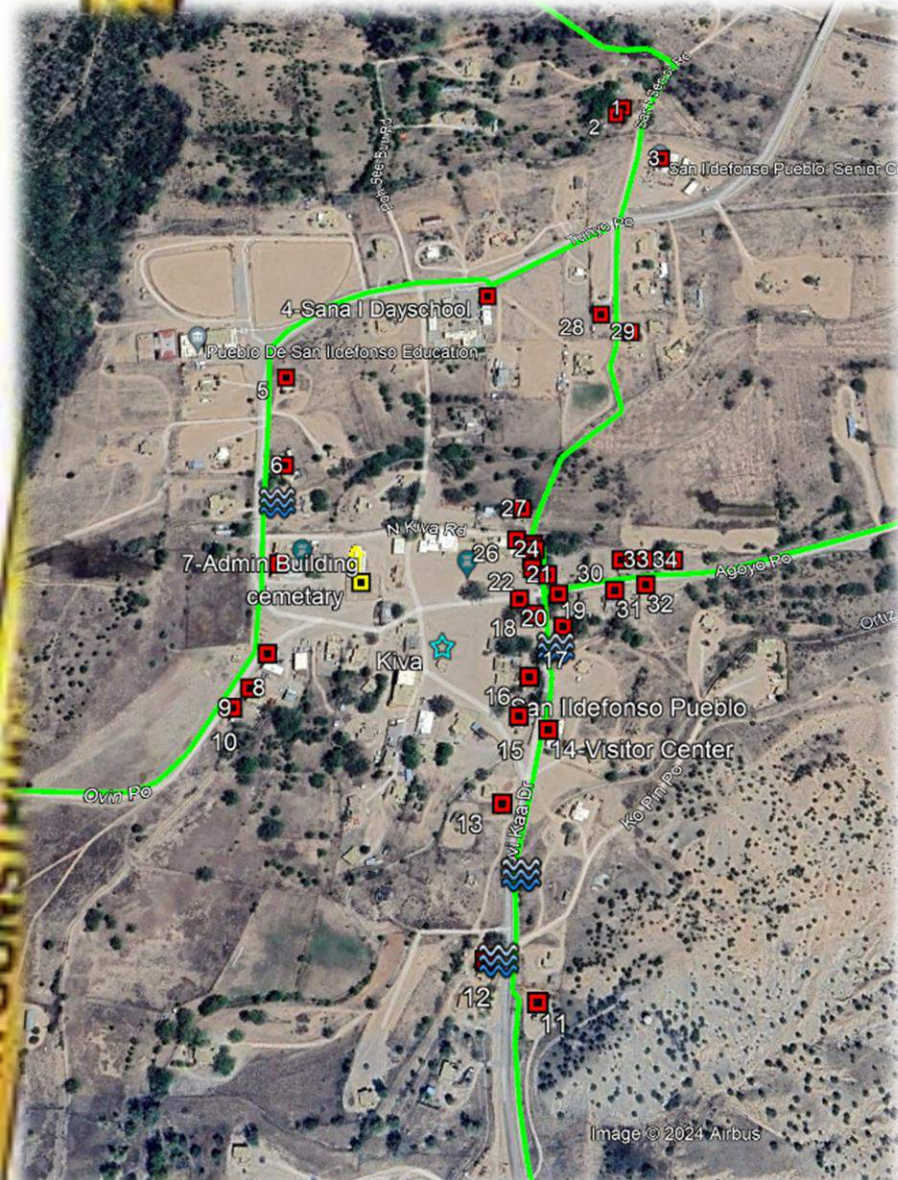

Hot News!

Vibration Monitoring is coming!



Construction of the Pojoaque Basin Regional Water System (PBRWS) project will begin in your neighborhood in the near future.

This is a U.S. Department of the Interior (US DOI) and Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) construction project contracted to CDM Smith Constructors, Inc.

As part of the PBRWS project, it will be necessary to perform **pre-construction condition surveys** on selected structures, adjacent to construction areas within the Pueblo boundaries.

The **pre-construction condition surveys** will collect data about the condition of selected structures through visual inspection, digital photography, and videos to document any pre-existing cosmetic or structural conditions outside of the structures. This will include any cracks in walls and other defects caused by normal aging and environmental forces.

CDM Smith Constructors, Inc. pays for this vibration monitoring survey. All photographs taken will remain with the project engineer (BOR) in strict confidence. They will be maintained for three years, and then destroyed.

Please keep in mind, construction methods and equipment planned for use by CDM Constructors, Inc. will not cause cracking to your property. These surveys are intended for your security and to document the pre-construction condition of your building(s).

The **pre-construction condition survey** gives you an opportunity to talk with the project engineer about your role in the project and what to expect during the construction process.

The survey should take less than an hour and you need to be present with the contractor and Tribal Official.

A Tribal Official will contact you to schedule an appointment.

Indian Health Service (IHS)

Application for Sanitation Facilities (Water and Sewer Service) **Scattered Housing**

Public Law 86-121 allows Indian Health Services to assist members of federally recognized native tribes to access a potable drinking water supply and a safe means of disposing of wastewater for their home use.

The IHS has a Scattered Housing program to address these residential deficiencies. You may be eligible if your home meets basic standard of living requirements for example, its insulated, has electricity, indoor plumbing, etc. and your home meets the eligibility requirements of the Indian Health Service.

If you are in need of potable drinking water or a waste water system, please reach out to the Office of Project Management or the Tribal Administration Front Desk for an application.

A completed application consists of the following:

- 1) Tribal enrollment number.
- 2) Signed "Agreement to Participate in IHS Project."
- 3) Proof of your legal right to reside on the subject property
(i.e. copy of lease, deed, or letter from the Tribe indicating that you have been assigned this land).
- 4) If the application is for a HUD Home, the home must be paid off before qualifying for this program.
A statement from the San Ildefonso Housing Authority is required to verify payoff.
- 5) Obtain the signature of the Governor or Tribal Administrator on the application to certify Tribal approval of the application.

Public Law 86-121 allows the Indian Health Services to assist members of federally recognized native tribes in obtaining a potable drinking water supply and a safe means of disposing of waste water for their home use, provided that funds are available, that the homes meet basic standard of living requirements (well insulated, have electricity, indoor plumbing, etc.) and that the homes meet the eligibility requirements of the Indian Health Service.

Please complete this application and return to the Indian Health Service (IHS) Office of Environmental Health and Engineering located behind the Santa Fe Indian Hospital. A completed application consists of the following:

- 1) Provide enrollment number.
- 2) Signed "Agreement to Participate in IHS Project" form. (Page 2)
- 3) Applicant must provide proof of his/her legal right to reside to the property (i.e. copy of lease, deed, or letter from the Tribe indicating that you have been assigned this land).
- 4) If this application is for a HUD Home, the home must be paid off before qualifying for service. A statement from the Housing Authority is required to verify payoff.
- 5) Obtain the signature of the appropriate Tribal Official (e.g. Governor, Chairman, President, etc.) where indicated on page 2 of this application to certify Tribal approval of the application.

The above information will help us determine your eligibility for existing programs. Should you qualify for one of these programs; the information will also help the Indian Health Service (IHS) to design the water and sewer facilities that are needed.

All applicants that are eligible for service are responsible for clearing all obstructions and debris out of the work area needed to make requested repairs on and around their property. In addition, homes must have electrical power and in sound condition with fully operable plumbing (minimum plumbing required: flush toilet, bathroom lavatory, and a kitchen sink) including provisions against freezing. Mobile homes must be skirted and anchored to a secure foundation.

If you have a specific question or any concerns with this application please contact any representative in person or by phone at the Office of Environmental Health and Engineering (OEHE) located behind the Santa Fe Indian Hospital on 1700 Cerrillos Road in Santa Fe, NM.: Office Tel (505) 946-9570.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN AFTER YOU SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

This is the approximate order of events to serve a house with water and/or sewer services. A few of these activities may overlap or be completed out of sequence.

1. **Applicant** returns **completed** application form to the IHS, OEHE office in Santa Fe. For an application to be considered complete, all certifications must be attached as described on page one of the application. Applications can be delayed if incomplete. Once the application is considered to be complete and all of the requirements are met as outlined in this application, the review process will begin.
2. The IHS reviews application and determine if applicant is eligible for service with water and sewer facilities under IHS guidelines. If applicant is eligible and application is complete as described in item #1 above, the IHS certifies that application is complete and will continue through the application process. If ineligible, the applicant will be notified in writing by the Indian Health Service.
3. Upon determination of eligibility IHS will coordinates a site review by the following parties: Tribal Utility Department/Authority, Tribal Historic Preservation Officer and Archaeologist, Indian Health Service, and any other pertinent parties. During the site review, all parties walk over the approximate lot boundaries and access road with the Applicant (if present). Note: The purpose of the joint review is to quickly identify lots that would clearly be disapproved due to known poor soil percolation, low water pressure, archaeological concerns, poor to no road access, drainage concerns, etc.
4. The following will occur if all parties approve the lot at the site review: 1) The Indian Health Service will have an archaeological survey report completed by BIA or by a private archaeologist; 2) The I.H.S. will perform necessary site review, survey, soil analysis and cost estimation to determine if site can be served with water and sewer facilities.
5. If the Tribe has a Tribal Historic Preservation Officer (THPO) on staff, the IHS will work with the THPO on a letter of concurrence with the archeological report.
6. Once the Historic Preservation Office or Archaeologist has generated the archaeological survey, the IHS will send a Tribal Cultural Properties (TCP) letter to the Tribe for concurrence with the archeological report. The Governor/President/Chairman has 30 days to respond to this letter. After the IHS received concurrence from the Tribe, the TCP letter and archaeological report are sent to the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) for concurrence. The SHPO has 30 days to respond to this letter. Construction cannot begin until IHS receives concurrence from the SHPO.
7. Once the IHS determines that water and sewer services can be provided, I.H.S. will begin designing your water and/or sewer facilities.
8. After the water and/or sewer facilities are designed, IHS will work with the Tribe to have the facilities installed in one of the following ways:
 - a. By a contractor through tribal procurement: This means that the Tribe will have to contract with a contractor to perform the work
 - b. By a contractor through government procurement: This means that the IHS will have to contract with a contractor to perform the work
 - c. Tribal force account: This means that the Tribe has their own work crew that will install the facilities according to the Tribe's schedule.

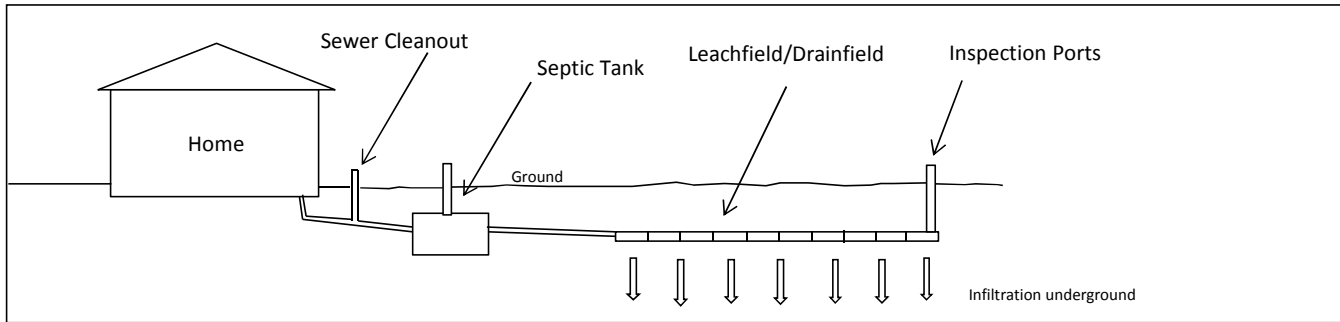

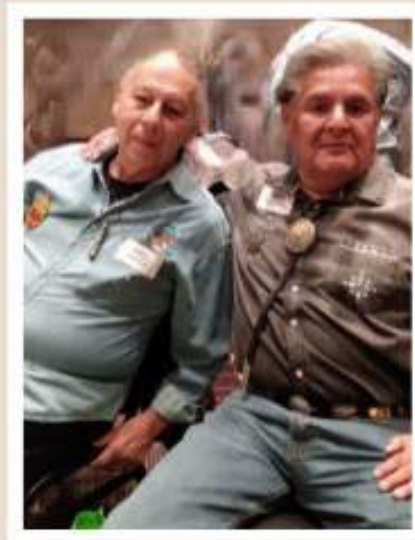
