
#### **QUITCLAIM DEEDS**

#### **Maintenance on Private Homes**

Taking care of home maintenance is the homeowner's responsibility, and SIHA is not required to cover the costs or offer maintenance services. However, in case of *emergency* maintenance related to *health* and *safety* during regular working hours (7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.), SIHA may provide help. Please be aware that the homeowner might have to bear the expenses since the current funding is allocated for managed units. Mr. Christopher Romero is the only employee who responds to emergency calls and is <u>not</u> available on an "On-Call" schedule.

Deer Tail II update, as of today 07/29/2024 concrete for curbs have been ongoing for about a week and shouldn't take too long to complete. Sewer and Water have both been connected to main lines and all water testing is complete. Bringing in of dirt will commence again to bring up grading on the northern side housing pads. So, at some point you will see trucks hauling dirt again. Paving should commence in mid-August. Vibration testing will be done in different areas of Battleship and Deer Tail to make sure we are within the parameters that do not cause structural damage. I will keep everyone updated on any upcoming work in the Deer Tail II area. Thank You

Once a candidate is sworn in as a Representative, the Representative shall have thirty days to establish residency within the exterior boundaries of the Pueblo as defined at the time of the adoption of this Agreement.

#### **Certification of Candidate Qualifications**

By signing below, I hereby certify that I meet the qualifications for elective office, and that upon election to office, I will follow the requirements for office including any requirement to establish my residency within the exterior boundaries of the Pueblo.

Under the Amended Election Law: Article III – Nominations; Section 1. Nominations, A Self – Nomination, 1. Any qualified member of the pueblo may submit his or her name in writing to the Election Commission as a candidate for elective office, along with a **non-refundable fee of \$25.00**.

#### **Consent to a Criminal Background Check**

I hereby agree to indemnify and hold harmless any person to whom this is lawfully presented and his agent and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including reasonable attorney fees, arising out or by reason of complying with this request. By signing below, I hereby acknowledge that I will be required to complete and sign an electronic email verification sent to me by **FIRST CHOICE BACKGROUND** within **2 days** of receiving **FIRST CHOICE'S** email to authorize the release of my investigative information. #### **Guaje Canyon Road**

Per the Pueblo's Land Claims Settlement, the U.S. Forest Service is required to maintain the road along the north face of Guaje Canyon to the top and to the gate of our new lands. As some of you know the road has been very treacherous and passable only with a UTV/ATV or 4 wheel drive. After several meetings with the USFS and pointing out to them their obligation for maintenance of the road, they finally agreed to do so. The work was completed last week. It will undoubtedly require periodic maintenance and we intend to hold the USFS to their commitment.

The road north from the gate is very washed out and almost impassable in some locations. We will look at finding resources to make these roads usable. Please use caution when traveling on any of these roads.

Enjoy your lands and keep them free from litter. Please feel free to report any unusual activity to the Tribal Rangers at (505) 219-7552.

San I Services General Update:

Dear Community Members,

We are thrilled to share an exciting update from San I Services! As we closed out our fiscal year on June 30, we are proud to announce the positive results we have achieved in collaboration with the Pueblo Alliance, SIS-CTI, and our convenience stores.

Thanks to our successful year, we were able to make significant progress. We have settled all outstanding taxes, some dating as far back as 2018, and cleared the note taken out to enhance the pumps at our stores. This year alone, we have returned approximately \$750,000 to the Pueblo.

We are pleased to inform you that SIS is now up-to-date with our tax payments, contributing around \$30,000 monthly, and actively investing in the development of our fiber and solar projects. Our upcoming plans include hosting community update meetings and commencing construction on the fiber project later this fall.

To ensure that our projects align with the community's needs, we will be organizing public meetings for both the solar and fiber initiatives starting in September. These meetings will provide insights into the projects, offer training opportunities, and seek interest for workforce development.

For those interested in technical training related to our projects, Santa Fe Community College offers classes that align with the skills required to construct and operate these projects.



#### Community Visits Ancestral Places


Over the past few months, three community visits to Ancestral villages have been organized by the Historic Preservation Office. We visited Tsirege and the Meteor rock art site, Motandad Canyon and Sandia Cave Canyon, and Nake-muu.

The visits were designed with the help of LANL archaeologists for community members to visit Ancestral places now difficult to visit because of the LANL security. Nake-muu required community members to receive visitor badges and the LANL bus to travel through four security gates. Creating more accessibility to Ancestral places is an aspiration for the visits.

Tsirege is a large village, occupied by San Ildefonso Ancestors 1325 to 1600 AD, consisting of approximately 800 rooms, sitting on a bluff above today's White Rock with fantastic and endless views to the east. The village is the home of the Avanyu image that inspired a San Ildefonso pottery revolution. The Comet site documents a 1264 AD meteor shower. The rock art etched into the Water Canyon wall surface.



Mortandad Canyon includes hundreds of living and storage rooms and staircases carved into a sheer soft tufa rock mesa face. On top of the mesa sits Sandia Pueblo, a small Ancestral village. Many of the caves are blackened from fires and on the surfaces are a variety of petroglyphs. Unfortunately, the art work has been vandalized and there are now steel gates blocking entrance to caves. As one San I elder lamented, "the metal cages keep the images' prayers locked up and keep our prayers from being heard."



Nake-muu Owin-geh is another San Ildefonso Ancestral home of wonderful vistas and beauty and significance. It is a place of reverence for the community occupying the narrow end of a mesa between Water Canyon and Canon del Valle. Many of the rooms retain standing walls with their stone and mud chinking and plastering. First occupied 1200-1350 AD and reoccupied during the Pueblo Revolt years. Built in about 1275 AD, in more recent times it was re-occupied by women and children to protect them from the Spanish during the Spanish return and attempts to subdue the village in the late 1600s.

As part of the PBRWS project, it will be necessary to perform *pre-construction condition surveys* on selected structures, adjacent to construction areas within the Pueblo boundaries.

The *pre-construction condition surveys* will collect data about the condition of selected structures through visual inspection, digital photography, and videos to document any pre-existing cosmetic or structural conditions outside of the structures. This will include any cracks in walls and other defects caused by normal aging and environmental forces.

CDM Smith Constructors, Inc. pays for this vibration monitoring survey. All photographs taken will remain with the project engineer (BOR) in strict confidence. They will be maintained for three years, and then destroyed.

Please keep in mind, construction methods and equipment planned for use by CDM Constructors, Inc. will not cause cracking to your property. These surveys are intended for your security and to document the pre-construction condition of your building(s).

The *pre-construction condition survey* gives you an opportunity to talk with the project engineer about your role in the project and what to expect during the construction process.
